# WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opens its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team did not suffer a shutout in 2022-23, and the last time the team was shutout was on Apr. 24, 2022, in a 3-0 loss to Detroit at the Rock.

The 82 games played last season marked the longest stretch in franchise history for a single season that the team didn't suffer a shutout.

Prior to 2022-23, the longest stretch in a single season that the Devils did not suffer a shutout was 80 games, which were played from Oct. 9, 1987, to Apr. 3, 1988.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

New Jersey enters tonight's contest with an overall record of 22-10-4-4 in season-opening games since 1982-83.

Jersey's team owns a home record of 13-3-2-3 when opening a regular season at home since 1982-83.

Tonight's Eastern Conference affair marks the third time (since 1982-83) that the Devils open a regular season vs Detroit:

1990-91, Oct. 4, 3-3 tie | Brendan Bryne Arena

1996-97, Oct. 5, 3-1 win | Continental Airlines Arena

### **OPENING NIGHT**

The most goals that the franchise scored in a regular-season opening game (home or away) was eight goals, which was recorded in an 8-4 win vs Montreal on Oct. 6, 2000, at New Jersey.

The most goals that an NHL team scored in a season opener was the Canadiens in a 12-5 win at the Quebec Bulldogs on Dec. 24, 1919. The last team that scored 10, or more, goals in a season opening contest was Chicago in a 10-1 win vs Pittsburgh, per NHL Pr.

### **COACH'S CORNER**

Head Coach Lindy Ruff enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11<sup>th</sup>.

owns 834 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 16 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff owns 98 career regular-season wins with New Jersey and needs two more victories for 100 career wins with the Devils. His 100 career wins with New Jersey would tie him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with New Jersey.

Ruff has coached 220 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249 career regular-season games with New Jersey.

#### **LOOKING AHEAD**

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 14 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

#### **THE SWISS CONNECTION**

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier, Timo Meier, Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

## **COMEBACK KIDS**

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

#### **DID YOU KNOW...**

The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs Detroit is eight, which was earned in an 8-5 win on Mar. 9, 1985, at Detroit.

The most goals that the Devils allowed in a single game vs Detroit in eight, three times, last logged on Feb. 9, 1993, in an 8-5 loss at Detroit.

The most shots that Jersey earned in a single game vs Detroit is 44, which was recorded on Feb. 12, 1990, after a 1-1 tie at New Jersey.

The most shots that the Devils allowed in a single game vs Detroit is 47, which was logged on Feb. 23, 1982, in a 6-3 loss at New Jersey.

The last time the Devils shut out the Red Wings was Jan. 28, 2003, after a 1-0 win at New Jersey (M. Brodeur, 15 saves).

The last time Detroit shut out the Devils was Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss at the Rock (A. Nedeljkovic, 17 saves).

The two foes have met once in the postseason, which was during the 1994-95 Stanley Cup Final (Devils, 4-0, Stanley Cup champions).

# **PLAYER NOTES**

**Jack Hughes** enters his fifth NHL season since first lacing up the skates with Jersey in 2019-20. The left-handed shot posted a franchise record 99 PTS (43g-56a) last season, and his 43 goals and 99 points were the most that a centerman earned in a single season for franchise history.

Hughes became the ninth player in franchise history who recorded 40, or more goals, in a single season. The only player in franchise history who recorded consecutive 40-goal seasons was John MacLean from 1988-89 to 1990-91 (3 consecutive seasons).

The youngster also netted his first hat-trick last season, which was earned on Nov. 26, 2022, vs Washington at the Rock.

Only **Nico Hischier** (6) has scored more overtime goals with the Devils than **Jack Hughes** (4) for current New Jersey skaters.

Hughes led all Devils skaters with 336 shots last season, which also ranked fifth for all NHL skaters in 2022-23. His 336 shots were the third most earned in a single season for franchise history:

Z. Parise: 2008-09, 364 SOG

Z. Parise: 2009-10, 347 SOG

**Dougie Hamilton** shined in his second season with Jersey's team, after he netted 22 goals. The blueliner's 22 tallies tied the franchise record for the most goals earned by a defenseman in a single season (B. Beck, 1977-78, CLR).

Hamilton's 74 (22g-52a) points last season were the second most earned in a single season by a defenseman for franchise history:

S. Stevens: 1993-94, 78 PTS (18g-60a)

Hamilton's 74 points ranked fourth in the NHL last season, while Erik Karlsson ranked first (25g-76a-101PTS).

Captain **Nico Hischier** enters his third season wearing the "C" and the Swiss native is fresh off a career-high 80 PTS (31g-49a) in 2022-23. It marked the first NHL campaign that Hischier earned 30 goals in a single season, and he also posted a career-high plus/minus rating at +33.

#### EVERYBODY'S TALKING 'BOUT THE NEW KIDS IN TOWN

Fellow countryman **Timo Meier** enters his first full season with New Jersey, after the forward earned a career-high 40 goals in 2022-23. Meier earned nine goals and five assists for 14 points in 21 regular-season contests with the Devils last season.

Meier also changed his number from 96 to 28, and became the 28th player in franchise history to wear the number.

**Luke Hughes** made his NHL debut late last season (Apr. 11 vs BUF), and enters his official rookie campaign. Hughes netted the overtime winning goal in his second career game (Apr. 13, at WSH), and became the third player in franchise history whose first career NHL goal was earned in overtime (Y. Sharangovich & J. Merrill).

**Tyler Toffoli** was acquired in an offseason trade from Calgary and is fresh off career-highs for goals (34), assists (39) and points (73). Additionally, the forward netted a career-high 10 PPG in 2022-23, and also netted four game-winning goals. Toffoli is the first player in franchise history to wear No. 73.

Veteran skaters **Tomas Nosek**, **Chris Tierney** and **Colin Miller** also joined the fold. Miller and Nosek were teammates together in 2017-18 with Vegas – which advanced to the 2017-18 Stanley Cup Final.

#### TIMELESS...

**Dawson Mercer** has played in 164 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 164 consecutive games played currently ranked tied for 15th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Luke and Jack Hughes can become the first set of brothers in franchise history who score a goal in the same game.

# **BETWEEN THE PIPES**

**Vitek Vanecek** recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

**Akira Schmid** shined in the 2022-23 playoffs, and earned his first-career postseason shutout (vs NYR) and became the third rookie netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Swiss native was the first rookie netminder in franchise history who earned two shutouts in a single postseason.

Schmid became the first netminder in franchise history who won his first-three career postseason appearances.
