WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opens its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team did not suffer a shutout in 2022-23, and the last time the team was shutout was on Apr. 24, 2022, in a 3-0 loss to Detroit at the Rock.

The 82 games played last season marked the longest stretch in franchise history for a single season that the team didn't suffer a shutout.

Prior to 2022-23, the longest stretch in a single season that the Devils did not suffer a shutout was 80 games, which were played from Oct. 9, 1987, to Apr. 3, 1988.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000. The team enters Friday night's contest vs Florida with 87 consecutive regular-season games without being shutout.

New Jersey's power play is ranked tied for ninth (EDM) in NHL: 27.3%, 3/11.

After Thursday night's win vs Detroit, the Devils improved to 23-10-4-4 in season-opening games since 1982-83.

Jersey's team now owns a home record of 14-3-2-3 when opening a regular season at home since 1982-83.

New Jersey kicks off the 2023-24 regular season with a three-game homestand, which concludes on Monday vs Florida. The team then plays at the NY Islanders on Fri., Oct. 20, for its first road contest of the season.

New Jersey is scheduled to wear its black alternate jersey for the first time on Oct. 27, vs Buffalo.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 835 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 15 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff owns 99 career regular-season wins with New Jersey and needs one more victory for 100 career wins with the Devils. His 100 career wins with New Jersey would tie him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with New Jersey.

Ruff has coached 222 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249th career regular-season game with New Jersey.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier**, **Timo Meier**, **Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

DID YOU KNOW...

The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs Florida is seven goals, which was earned twice, last earned: Nov. 9, 2021, at the Rock (7-3, W).

The most goals that the Devils allowed in a single game vs Florida is seven, which was logged on Apr. 2, 2022, in a 7-6 overtime loss at the Rock.

The most shots that Jersey earned in a single game vs Florida is 50, which was recorded on Mar. 23, 2004, in a 4-3 win at Florida.

The most shots that the Devils allowed in a single game vs Florida is 47, which was logged on Apr. 10, 1994, in a 2-2 tie at Florida.

The last time that the Devils shut out Florida was on Jan. 20, 2010, after a 2-0 win at the Rock (M. Brodeur, 22 saves).

The last time Florida shut out the Devils was on Jan. 9, 2017, in a 2-0 loss at the Rock (R. Luongo, 28 saves).

The Devils and Florida met in the Stanley Cup Playoffs twice. New Jersey swept the Cats in 1999-00 during the Eastern Conference Quarter-Finals, and then eliminated Florida in seven games during the 2011-12 ECF Quarter-Finals.

Hughes also logged two penalties on opening night vs Detroit, which marked just the second time in his career that he served multiple penalties in a single game, last: 4/18/21 vs NYR (12 PIM).

Additionally, Hughes earned his first career roughing penalty during regular-season play...took a rough against Carolina in the 2022-23 Stanley Cup Playoffs (Game 3).

Hughes logged three assists on Friday, Oct. 13, which tied a career-high. The last, and first, time that Hughes earned three helpers in a single contest was on Feb. 24, 2022, at Pittsburgh.

Hughes' career-high for points in a game is four, which he logged on Apr. 6, 2023, in an 8-1 win vs Columbus (2g-2a).

Jesper Bratt logged his 13th multi-goal game on Oct. 13, vs Arizona (2g-1a), after he also netted a power-play goal in the outing. The three-point effort also tied a career-high, which Bratt has now recorded 12 times.

HOW SWISS IT IS

Jonas Siegenthaler not only led all skaters in Thursday's win vs Detroit with three points (0g-3a), but earned his first-career three-assist outing. It also marked the defenseman's third-career three-point night, last: Feb. 25, 2023, vs PHI (1g-2a).

Per NHL Pr, "Jonas Siegenthaler (0-3—3) posted three assists and joined Will Butcher (0-3—3 on Oct. 7, 2017) and Viacheslav Fetisov (1-2—3 on Oct. 5, 1991) as the third defenseman in Devils/Rockies/Scouts history to record three points in a season-opening game."

Additionally, Siegenthaler leads the team with six blocks, after he led New Jersey with three blocks in each of the team's first two games of 2023-24.

QUICK HITS

Tomas Nosek played in his 400th career NHL game on Fri., Oct. 13.

New Jersey fell to 1-0-1 when allowing the first goal in a game this season.

Tyler Toffoli earned an assists in consecutive games, after connecting with fellow linemates J. Hughes and Bratt – Bratt's second goal of the contest (PPG).

Blueliner **Brendan Smith** logged five shots on goal, which marked the seventh time in his career that he recorded five, or more, shots in a single game. Smith's career-high is six shots on goal in a game, which he logged three times, last: 4/21/22 vs WPG, as a member CAR.

The five shots on goal marked his most since joining the Devils last season.

Alexander Holtz left the game early in the third period and did not return after a puck deflected toward his cheek area.

Nathan Bastian logged his season debut on Fri., Oct. 13 (10:37 TOI) and replaced **Curtis Lazar** on the Nosek-McLeod line (right-side).

EVERYBODY'S TALKING 'BOUT THE NEW KIDS IN TOWN

Timo Meier enters his first full season with New Jersey, after the forward earned a career-high 40 goals in 2022-23. Meier earned nine goals and five assists for 14 points in 21 regular-season contests with the Devils last season.

Meier also changed his number from 96 to 28, and became the 28th player in franchise history to wear the number.

Luke Hughes made his NHL debut late last season (Apr. 11 vs BUF), and enters his official rookie campaign. Hughes netted the overtime-winning goal in his second career game (Apr. 13, at WSH), and became the third player in franchise history whose first career NHL goal was earned in overtime (Y. Sharangovich & J. Merrill).

Tyler Toffoli was acquired in an offseason trade from Calgary and is fresh off career-highs for goals (34), assists (39) and points (73). Additionally, the forward netted a career-high 10 PPG in 2022-23, and also netted four game-winning goals. Toffoli is the first player in franchise history to wear No. 73.

Veteran skaters **Tomas Nosek**, **Chris Tierney** and **Colin Miller** also joined the fold. Miller and Nosek were teammates together in 2017-18 with Vegas – which advanced to the 2017-18 Stanley Cup Final.

TIMELESS...

Dawson Mercer has played in 166 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 166 consecutive games played currently ranks tied for 15th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Luke and Jack Hughes can become the first set of brothers in franchise history who score a goal in the same game.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.
