WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opens its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team did not suffer a shutout in 2022-23, and the last time the team was shutout was on Apr. 24, 2022, in a 3-0 loss to Detroit at the Rock.

The 82 games played last season marked the longest stretch in franchise history for a single season that the team didn't suffer a shutout.

Prior to 2022-23, the longest stretch in a single season that the Devils did not suffer a shutout was 80 games, which were played from Oct. 9, 1987, to Apr. 3, 1988.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000. The team enters Friday night's contest vs New York with 88 consecutive regular-season games without being shut out.

Jersey's team concluded a three-game homestand on Mon., Oct. 18, which resulted in a 4-3 loss to Florida. The team earned a 4-2 victory on opening night vs Detroit, but then dropped the next to contests (ARI & FLA).

The Devils enter Friday night's Metropolitan Division showdown as one of three teams (STL, DAL, per Oct. 19) in the NHL that haven't scored a goal in the first period of play for 2023-24. Overall, the Devils were outshot 39-22 in the first period of play for the 2023-24 campaign.

All of New Jersey's contests were decided by one goal this season. In 2022-23, the Devils earned a 20-6-8 record for games decided by one goal, which ranked eighth in the NHL (CAR ranked 1st, 25-6-9).

Friday night's contest marks New Jersey's first game vs a divisional foe. The Devils posted an 18-6-2 record vs the Metropolitan division in 2022-23. The team's 18 wins vs the division ranked second for MET teams, while Carolina ranked first with a 19-6-1 divisional record.

Friday's contest also marks New Jersey's first road contest for the 203-24 campaign. The Devils earned a 28-9-4 road record in 2022-23, which ranked third in the NHL (BOS 1st, 31-8-2).

New Jersey's 28 road wins in 2022-23 tied the franchise record for the most road wins, which was logged in 1998-99 (28-10-3).

New Jersey is scheduled to wear its black alternate jersey for the first time on Oct. 27, vs Buffalo.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 835 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 15 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff owns 99 career regular-season wins with New Jersey and needs one more victory for 100 career wins with the Devils. His 100 career wins with New Jersey would tie him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with New Jersey.

Ruff has coached 223 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249th career regular-season game with New Jersey.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier, Timo Meier, Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

DID YOU KNOW...

The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs New York is nine goals, which was earned in a 9-7 win on Apr. 6, 1986, at New Jersey.

The most goals that the franchise allowed in a single game vs New York is nine (4 times), which was last logged on Mar. 17, 1983, in a 9-5 loss at New Jersey.

The most shots that Jersey earned in a single game vs the Isles is 57, which was recorded on Apr., 12, 1999, in a 4-2 loss at New Jersey.

The most shots that the franchise allowed in a single game vs New York is 51, which was logged on Feb., 22, 1977, in a 2-1 loss at New York (CLR).

The last time that the Devils shut out New York was on Nov. 11, 2021, in a 3-0 win at the Rock (M. Blackwood, 37 saves)

The last time New York shut out the Devils was on Nov. 3rd, 2018, after a 3-0 loss at the Isles.

The Devils and Isles met in the Stanley Cup Playoffs once, which was in the 1987-88 Division Semi-Finals (Round 1). New Jersey eliminated the Isles in six games.

Hughes leads the team with 16 shots on goal, which is ranked (tied with Matthew Tkachuk) for 11th in the NHL. As of Oct. 19, Jack Eichel led the NHL with 25 shots.

Jesper Bratt owns five points (3g-2a) in his last two games played. The most multi-point games that Bratt recorded in a single season for his career was 18, which was earned in 2021-22.

Dougie Hamilton leads all Devils blueliners at 22:29 ATOI per game. The 6-foot-6 defenseman recorded goals in the team's first two games, and is riding a three-game point streak.

Hamilton's career-high point streak is 14 games, which he earned from Feb. 27, 2021-Mar. 27, 2021, with Carolina.

HOW SWISS IT IS

Jonas Siegenthaler not only led all skaters in the team's regular-season opener on Thur., Oct. 12, vs Detroit with three points (0g-3a), but earned his first-career three-assist outing. It also marked the defenseman's third-career three-point night, last: Feb. 25, 2023, vs PHI (1g-2a).

Per NHL Pr, "**Jonas Siegenthaler** (0-3—3) posted three assists and joined **Will Butcher** (0-3—3 on Oct. 7, 2017) and **Viacheslav Fetisov** (1-2—3 on Oct. 5, 1991) as the third defenseman in Devils/Rockies/Scouts history to record three points in a season-opening game."

Additionally, Siegenthaler leads the team with six blocks, after he led New Jersey with three blocks in each of the team's first two games of 2023-24.

QUICK HITS

Erik Haula earned his first multi-point game (1g-1a) for the season on Mon., Oct. 19, vs Florida. The Finnish native recorded eight multi-point games last season.

Captain **Nico Hischier** was 15/20 (75%) on face-offs Monday night vs Florida. The 15 face-off wins marked a team-high for the Devils in 2023-24. The captain is still seeking his first point of the season. After recording a career-high for goals (31), assists (49) and points (80) in 2022-23.

Tomas Nosek played in his 400th career NHL game on Fri., Oct. 13.

New Jersey fell to 1-1-1 when allowing the first goal in a game this season.

Tyler Toffoli earned one assist in both of the team's first two games to kick-off his first season with New Jersey, but was held off the score sheet on Monday in the team's third game for 2023-24.

Hischier (2g-2a) and **Bratt** (0g-4a) led the Devils with four points against the Islanders last season. Since Hischier and Bratt's rookie season in 2017-18, they lead all players who've played with New Jersey in points against the Isles.

Hischier: 18 GP, 5g-7a-12 PTS

Bratt: 19 GP, 1g-10a-11 PTS

New Jersey's record at UBS Arena since it opened in 2021-22 is 1-3-0. The team's lone victory was earned on Oct. 20, 2022, which also witnessed the Devils not allow a shot on goal until 16:43 into the first period. New Jersey defeated Isles by a score of 4-1.

Ondrej Palat's first career multi-goal (2g-0a) game was registered on Oct. 20, 2022, at the Isles.

EVERYBODY'S TALKING 'BOUT THE NEW KIDS IN TOWN

Timo Meier enters his first full season with New Jersey, after the forward earned a career-high 40 goals in 2022-23. Meier earned nine goals and five assists for 14 points in 21 regular-season contests with the Devils last season.

Meier also changed his number from 96 to 28, and became the 28th player in franchise history to wear the number.

Luke Hughes made his NHL debut late last season (Apr. 11 vs BUF), and enters his official rookie campaign. Hughes netted the overtime-winning goal in his second career game (Apr. 13, at WSH), and became the third player in franchise history whose first career NHL goal was earned in overtime (Y. Sharangovich & J. Merrill).

Tyler Toffoli was acquired in an offseason trade from Calgary and is fresh off career-highs for goals (34), assists (39) and points (73). Additionally, the forward netted a career-high 10 PPG in 2022-23, and also netted four game-winning goals. Toffoli is the first player in franchise history to wear No. 73.

Veteran skaters **Tomas Nosek**, **Chris Tierney** and **Colin Miller** also joined the fold. Miller and Nosek were teammates together in 2017-18 with Vegas – which advanced to the 2017-18 Stanley Cup Final.

TIMELESS...

Dawson Mercer has played in 167 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 167 consecutive games played currently ranks 15th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Luke and **Jack Hughes** can become the first set of brothers in franchise history who score a goal in the same game.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Akira Schmid shined in the 2022-23 playoffs, and earned his first-career postseason shutout (vs NYR) and became the third rookie netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Swiss native was the first rookie netminder in franchise history who earned two shutouts in a single postseason.

Schmid became the first netminder in franchise history who won his first-three career postseason appearances.

Vanecek started in the team's opener, while Schmid played the next night on Oct. 13, vs Arizona.

Vanecek played in the team's last game on Oct. 16 vs Florida.

Schmid's first-career NHL game was against the Isles on Dec. 11, 2021 (4-2 loss).
