WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opens its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils concluded their third back-to-back set for 2023-24 and are now 3-2-1 overall for back-to-back sets in 2023-24. The team is also 0-2-1 in the second half of a back-to-back set for the season.

Jersey's team was held to one goal in a contest for the first time this season. The last time that the Devils were held to one goal in a game was Apr. 8, 2023, after a 2-1 loss at Boston.

The Devils were held to one goal 11 times last season, and earned one victory when scoring just one goal in a game for 2022-23 (Oct. 28, 2022, vs COL, 1-0, W).

The team witnessed its season-high three-game winning streak end, after the 4-1 loss at St. Louis.

New Jersey's road record fell to 3-1-0 for 2023-24. The team concludes its three game road trip on Tuesday at Colorado.

Jack Hughes fell and collided into the boards, after the forward created separation from two St. Louis defensemen entering the offensive zone, but then tripped over Blues' goaltender J. Binnington's stick (shot attempted).

Hughes returned on the next shift on a power-play, but then exited the game after the shift. Hughes' left the ice with 8:25 remaining in the first period. Hughes did not return to the game (upper-body inj.).

Jersey's team recorded three power-play goals on Thursday night, which marked the sixth time this season that the team earned multiple power-play goals in a game. The most power-play goals that the team earned in a game this season was four, which was logged on Oct. 20, 2023, at the NY Islanders.

However, the team was 0/1 on the power play vs St. Louis on Fri., Nov. 3. It marked the second time this season that the team did not convert on the man advantage.

The team earned four multi-power-play goal games all of last season.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game five times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

Jersey's team did not suffer a shutout in 2022-23, and the last time the team was shutout was on Apr. 24, 2022, in a 3-0 loss to Detroit at the Rock.

The 82 games played last season marked the longest stretch in franchise history for a single season that the team didn't suffer a shutout.

Prior to 2022-23, the longest stretch in a single season that the Devils did not suffer a shutout was 80 games, which were played from Oct. 9, 1987, to Apr. 3, 1988.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000. The team enters Sunday's contest vs Chicago with 95 consecutive regular-season games without being shut out, which is the third longest stretch in franchise history:

IN THE DOTS

New Jersey won a season-high 38 of 60 face-offs (63%) on Tue., Oct. 24th vs Montreal. The last time that the team won 38, or more, face-offs in a game was Mar. 25, 2023, vs Ottawa (39/68, 57.4%).

Michael McLeod was 10 of 12 (83.3%) on face-off against Minnesota on Thursday, Nov. 2. Yet, the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more in a GP) was 86.7%, after McLeod won 13 of 15 face-offs against Montreal on Oct. 24.

The Devils rank seventh in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.4%, per Nov. 4).

McLeod ranked sixth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (61.4%, per Nov. 4).

Per Nov. 4, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 61.2%.



New Jersey wore its black alternate jerseys for the first time this season, after a 5-4 win against Buffalo on Oct. 27 (5-4 win). The team logged a 6-3-1 record last season when donning the alternate sweater.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 840 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 10 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff now owns 104 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Doug Carpenter for fourth place all-time in franchise history for head coaches.

Ruff has coached 230 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249th career regular-season game with New Jersey.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier, Timo Meier, Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).
