WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils are scheduled to play in three games this week, which entails a home-at-home set on Fri., Nov. 24, and Sat., Nov. 25.

The last time that the Devils played on Black Friday was Nov. 25, 2022, after a 3-1 win at Buffalo.

The last time that the Devils played on Black Friday at home was Nov. 23, 2018, after a 4-3 overtime loss vs the New York Islanders.

The team dressed 11 forwards and seven defensemen for the second time this season on Sat., Nov. 18, against the New York Rangers. The team is 1-1-0 when dressing 11 forwards and seven defensemen this season.

The teams own 23 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 16 games played. The 23 power-play goals are tied for the most in franchise history after the team's opening 16 games from the start of a season (1992-93 & 1986-87).

Entering Wednesday's contest, the Devils' power-play ranked first in the NHL at 39.0%.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game eight times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

The eight games which the Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals rank first in the NHL. Detroit, Tampa and Vancouver rank second for this matter with six multi power-play goal games in 2023-24.

LIGHTING THE LAMP

Jersey's team did not suffer a shutout in 2022-23, and the last time the team was shutout was on Apr. 24, 2022, in a 3-0 loss to Detroit at the Rock.

The 82 games played last season marked the longest stretch in franchise history for a single season that the team didn't suffer a shutout.

Prior to 2022-23, the longest stretch in a single season that the Devils did not suffer a shutout was 80 games, which were played from Oct. 9, 1987, to Apr. 3, 1988.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

The team enters Wednesday's contest vs Detroit with 101 consecutive regular-season games without being shut out, which is the third-longest stretch in franchise history:

New Jersey's 101 consecutive games without being shut out are the second-longest active streak currently in the NHL, while Toronto ranks first at 162 games.

The longest streak without experiencing a shutout all-time was Calgary – 264 consecutive games from Nov. 12, 1981, to Jan. 9, 1985.

IN THE DOTS

New Jersey won a season-high 39 face-offs on Tue., November 7, at Colorado. The team's season-high face-off% in 2023-24 is 63.3%, which was earned on Oct. 24, at Montreal (38/60), and then also on Nov. 2 at Minnesota (31/49).

Keep an eye on... **Michael McLeod** ranked fourth in the NHL for overall face-off% (61.7.0%), per Nov 21.

McLeod's owns the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more in a GP) was 86.7%, after McLeod won 13 of 15 face-offs against Montreal on Oct. 24.

McLeod earned a career-high 16 face-off wins, after Tue., Nov. 14th's contest at Winnipeg. The 16 face-off wins also marked the most that a Devils skater earned this season.

The Devils ranked sixth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (52.8%, per Nov. 21).

Per Nov. 21, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 58.8%.

JERSEY

New Jersey wore its black alternate jerseys for the first time this season, after a 5-4 win against Buffalo on Oct. 27 (5-4 win). The team logged a 6-3-1 record last season when donning the alternate sweater.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 842 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 8 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 106 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Doug Carpenter for fourth place all-time in franchise history for head coaches.

Ruff has coached 236 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249th career regular-season game with New Jersey.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier**, **Timo Meier**, **Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

DID YOU KNOW...

The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs the Red Wings was in a 8-5 win vs Detroit on Mar. 9, 1985.

The most goals that the Devils allowed in a single game vs *the Wings* is eight, three times, with the last being on Feb. 9, 1993, in an 8-5 loss at Detroit.

The most shots that Jersey earned in a single game vs Detroit is 44, after a 1-1 tie on Feb. 12, 1990, in Jersey.

The most shots that the Devils/Rockies/Scouts allowed in a single game vs the Wings is 47, on Feb. 23, 1982, in Colorado.

The last time the Devils shut out the Wings was on Jan. 28, 2003, in a 1-0 win at Continental Airlines Arena.

The last time Detroit shut out the Devils was on Apr. 24, in a 3-0 loss at the Rock.

PLAYER NOTES

Jack Hughes was named the NHL's First Star of the Month for October, after the 22-year-old recorded 18 points (5g-13a) in eight games.

The feat marked the second time in Hughes' career that he was named the NHL's First Star of the Month, after he earned the nod in January of 2023.

Hughes logged eight shots on Sat., Nov. 21, vs the New York Rangers, which marked a team-high for 2023-24. Hughes' career-high for shots on goal in a single game is 10, which he earned twice, last: Mar. 21, 2023, vs MIN.

Jesper Bratt leads the NHL with 16 power-play points (4g-12a) in 2023-24, per Nov 21. Q. Hughes ranks second with 14 PPP (1g-13a).

Keep in mind that Bratt earned a career-high 22 power-play points (8g-14a) last season.

The most power-play points that a player earned in a single season for franchise history is 39, which Rob Ramage earned with Colorado in 1980-81. Hamilton's 118 career points with the Devils ranks 15th all-time in franchise history for defensemen, and he is one point shy of tying Alexei Kasatonov for 14th place all-time for defensemen in franchise history.

Hamilton owns six points (1g-5a) over the team's last five games played, which ranks first on the Devils since that time (Nov. 7, at COL).

New Jersey defensemen have combined for five power-play goals this season, which ranks first in the NHL.

Ondrej Palat extended his point-streak to three games (1g-2a), after the Czechia native earned his first goal of the season 19:12 into the first period on Sat., Nov. 18, vs the New York Rangers. The marker was also earned on the power-play, which nodded Palat's second-career power-play goal with New Jersey.

McLeod was 15/20 on face-offs (75%) on Thu. Nov. 16, while his 15 face-off wins led all skaters from the contest. The effort marked the second time this season, and in consecutive games, that McLeod won 15, or more, face-offs in a contest. His 16 face-off wins in the team's contest on Nov. 14, at Winnipeg marked a career-high for a single game played.

Thursday's effort marked the third time in McLeod's career that he won 15, or more, face-offs in a game.

Dawson Mercer logged his second goal for the season on Fri., Nov. 10, vs Washington, which also marked his 100th career point. At age 22, 14 days, Mercer became the 14th youngest Devil in franchise history who earned his 100th career point.

Kirk Muller, 20 years, 12 days, was the youngest Devil who earned all 100 of his career points (34g-66a) with the franchise.

Mercer owns four points (3g-1a) in his last five games played dating to Nov. 5 at Chicago.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Akira Schmid shined in the 2022-23 playoffs, and earned his first-career postseason shutout (vs NYR) and became the third rookie netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Swiss native was the first rookie netminder in franchise history who earned two shutouts in a single postseason.

Vanecek owns 40 career wins with New Jersey, which ranks 10th all-time in franchise history. Craig Billington ranks ninth for this matter with 43 career wins.

Schmid also earned his second assist for the season and his career. His two assists this season lead all NHL netminders.
