WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83. New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season. Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Week

The Devils began a four-game road trip on Tuesday in Vancouver, which also features three games in Western Canada against Vancouver, Calgary and Edmonton. The team also faces Seattle on Thu., Nov. 7 for a 10:30 P.M. E.T. puck drop.

Jersey is then scheduled for a back-to-back set against Calgary and Edmonton on Saturday and Sunday.

Last Game

The Devils opened a four-game road trip and played Vancouver for the first of two matchups this season.

Tuesday's matchup marked the first time that all three Hughes brothers played in the same NHL contest. Before the Dec. 5th, contest at Vancouver, Jack Hughes and the Devils owned a 5-1 record for the *Hughes Bowl*, which dates to Oct. 19, 2019.

Per NHL Pr, "The Hughes' became the second American family to have three or more brothers appear in the same NHL game. In 1989-90, Minnesotans Neal, Paul and Aaron Broten all skated together when the North Stars met the Rangers on Feb. 4, 1990 and March 10, 1990."

Per NHL Pr, the Hughes brothers became "the second trio of brothers in NHL history to each score in the same game. The only siblings to do so to date are Marian, Anton and Peter Stastny, last doing so nearly 39 years to the day – with the last of their 14 such outings occurring Dec. 8, 1984 vs. New Jersey."

The Devils recorded four goals in the first period, which marked the third time overall this season that the team netted four goals in a single period. The marker tied a season-high, but also nodded the second time that the team logged four goals in the game's opening frame for 2023-24 (Last: Nov. 25, vs BUF, 7-2, W).

Jersey's team improved to 8-1-1 when leading after two periods in a contest this season.

Tuesday's contest marked New Jersey's second contest vs a Pacific Division opponent (1-1-0). Jersey improved to 4-4-1 vs the Western Conference in 2023-24.

The Devils recorded six goals, or more, in a game for the second time this season; last: Nov. 25, 2023, vs Buffalo, 7-2 win.

Jersey's team was outshot 33-32, but improved to 4-6-0 when outshot in a contest for the 2023-24.

The Devils also improved to 15-2-2 vs Vancouver since 2013-14.

The team's 28 power-play goals this season were the most in the NHL, while Tampa's 27 PPG were second, per Wed., Dec. 6.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for seven power-play goals this season, which ranks first in the NHL, per Wed. Dec. 6.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game eight times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

The eight games which the Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals rank second in the NHL behind Detroit's nine.

LIGHTING THE LAMP/STREAK ENDED

The Devils streak without suffering a shutout of 101 consecutive games ended, after a 4-0 loss at Detroit on Wed., Nov. 22.

The streak dated back to Apr. 24, 2022, which was also a 3-0 loss to Detroit but at Prudential Center.

The 101 consecutive games without suffering a shutout over multiple seasons was the third-longest stretch in franchise history.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

The longest streaks in franchise history without suffering a shutout over multiple seasons:

New Jersey's 101 consecutive games without being shut out was the second-longest active streak currently in the NHL entering Wednesday, Nov. 22, contest at Detroit, while Toronto ranked first at 162 games.

The longest streak without experiencing a shutout all-time was Calgary - 264 consecutive games from Nov. 12, 1981, to Jan. 9, 1985.

IN THE DOTS

New Jersey won a season-high 39 face-offs on Tue., November 7, at Colorado. The team's season-high face-off% in 2023-24 is 63.3%, which was earned on Oct. 24, at Montreal (38/60), and then also on Nov. 2 at Minnesota (31/49).

Keep an eye on...Michael McLeod ranks third in the NHL for overall face-off% (62.3.%), per Wed., Dec. 6.

McLeod owns the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more face-offs in a GP) was 86.7%, after McLeod won 13 of 15 face-offs against Montreal on Oct. 24.

McLeod earned a career-high 16 face-off wins, after Tue., Nov. 14th's contest at Winnipeg.

Nico Hischier won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which marked the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.

The Devils ranked fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.3%).

Entering Thursday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 57.4%, per Wed., Dec. 6.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach Lindy Ruff enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 846 career regular season wins, which ranks fifth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He needs 4 wins to pass Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 110 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Doug Carpenter for fourth place all-time in franchise history for head coaches.

Ruff has coached 243 regular-season games with New Jersey, which are the fifth most for a head coach in franchise history. He'll pass Peter DeBoer for fourth place all-time in franchise history once he coaches in his 249th career regular-season game with New Jersey.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier**, **Timo Meier**, **Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The most shots that the Devils allowed against the Kraken is 40, which was logged in a 4-3 overtime loss on Jan. 19, 2023, at Seattle.

There has never been a shutout recorded for both teams against each other.

PLAYER NOTES

Jack Hughes was named the NHL Third Star of the Week (week ending on Dec. 3), after No. 86 recorded seven points (3g-4a), while also posting consecutive three points games. It marked the third time in Hughes' career that he was a Star of the Week, last earned: Weeke ending on Jan. 8, 2023.

Per NHL Pr, "Jack Hughes recorded his 30th point and required the third fewest games in a season to reach the mark among U.S-born players, behind only Pat LaFontaine (11 GP in 1992-93) and Kevin Stevens (12 GP in 1992-93)."

Hughes also required the fewest amount of games played to reach the 30-point bench mark for franchise history. Per NHL Pr, Hughes surpassed the benchmark of 21 games (reach 30 PTS) set by **Paul Gardner** in 1977-78.

Hughes logged a career-high 27:16 TOI on Fri., Dec. 1, while his prior career-high was 26:13 TOI – vs New York Islanders on Dec. 9, 2022.

Hughes enters Thursday's contest riding a five-game point streak (4g-7a), while his season-high point streak is seven games (Oct. 12-Oct. 27, (5g-13a).

Hughes is three goals (97) shy of 100 career tallies.

The 2019 No. 1 overall draft selection has recorded three, or more, points in a game seven times this season, which ranks first in the NHL. Boston's D. Pastrnak and Vancouver's J. Miller rank second for this matter with six games earning three, or more, points in a contest this season.

The most three-point games that Hughes logged in a single season was eight, which he earned in 2022-23.

The most three-point games that a Devils player recorded in franchise history is 11, which Kirk Muller earned in 1987-88.

Hughes is averaging 1.83 points, per game, which ranked first in the NHL, per Wed. Dec. 6. Tampa's N. Kucherov ranked second at 1.68 P/GP.

Jesper Bratt (4g-12a) ranks third in the NHL behind J. Miller (7g-10=17 PPP) and N. Kucherov's with 20 power-play points (6g-14a=20 PPP).

Keep in mind that Bratt earned a career-high 22 power-play points (8g-14a) last season.

The most power-play points that a player earned in a single season for franchise history is 39, which Rob Ramage earned with Colorado in 1980-81. The most power-play points earned in Devils team history for a single season is 37, which Taylor Hall earned in 2017-18 and then Kirk Muller recorded in 1987-88.

Bratt's four game-winning goals lead New Jersey this season. The Swedish forward is one of seven skaters this season with four, or more, game-winning goals. K. Connor led the NHL with five game-winners, per Wed., Dec. 6.

Bratt's career-high is six game-winning goals in a season, which was earned in 2021-22.

Bratt earned his 300th career point, after earning two assists on Sat., Nov. 25, vs Buffalo.

Bratt became one of 43 players all-time who were drafted in the sixth round (exactly) and earn 300 career points. Brett Hull's 1,391 points are the most earned by an NHL player who was selected in the sixth round of the NHL draft.

Bratt became the third player in franchise history who was drafted by the franchise in the sixth-round and earned 300 career points with the team:

Aaron Broten: 469 PTS, drafted by CLR in 1980

Bruce Driver: 399 PTS, draft by CLR in 1981

The trio of players are the only three draft picks in franchise history who were drafted in the sixth-round or later and earned 300 career points with the organization.

Luke Hughes' 15 points (4g-11a) are ranked for the most points that a rookie defenseman earned this season.

Hughes season-high/career-high TOI in a game this season was logged on Oct. 25, 2023, vs WSH (23:56 TOI).

Hughes' eight power-play points (3g-5a) ranks second for all NHL rookie skaters this season (L Cooley, 2g-8a=10 PPP).

Hughes' four multi-point games lead all NHL rookies this season, while three others earned three multi-point games in 2023-24.

Brotherly Love...J. and L. Hughes have factored in together on six Devils goals this season.

Hughes earned his second-career overtime goal, after Thursday's win at Philadelphia (vs WSH, Apr. 13, 2023).

Per NHL Pr, Luke Hughes became the first rookie in franchise history to score multiple overtime goals after netting his first on April 13.

Per NHL Pr, Luke Hughes became the seventh rookie defenseman in NHL history with multiple overtime goals. He joined Shayne Gostisbehere (4), Moritz Seider (2), Cam Fowler (2), P.K. Subban (2), Jamie McBain (2) and Brent Seabrook (2).

Dawson Mercer logged his second goal for the season on Fri., Nov. 10, vs Washington, which also marked his 100th career point. At age 22, 14 days, Mercer became the 14th youngest Devil in franchise history who earned his 100th career point.

Kirk Muller, 20 years, 12 days, was the youngest Devil who earned all 100 of his career points (34g-66a) with the franchise.

Mercer scored New Jersey's first-ever goal against the Kraken on Oct. 19, 2021, in a 4-2 win. It also marked Mercer's first-career NHL goal.

700 CLUB

Ondrej Palat played in his 700th career NHL game VIA Tue., Dec. 5, at Vancouver, and became the 41st Czechia native who played in 700, or more, NHL contests all-time.

CHIPPING IN

Nate Bastian earned his third point of the season, after collecting the primary assist on **Michael McLeod's** first-period goal on Tue., Dec. 5, at Vancouver. No. 14 snapped a seven-game point drought.

Blueliners **Kevin Bahl** and **Jonas Siegenthaler** both earned an assist on Tuesday at Vancouver, which marked Bahl's fourth helper and Siegenthaler's fifth assist for the season.

Bahl later finished the night with two helpers, after he collected the secondary assist on Bratt's game-winner 19:26 into the third period. It marked Bahl's third-career multi-point game, which tied a career-high; last earned: Mar. 24, 2023, at Buffalo, 1g-1a.

Tuesday's contest at Vancouver also marked the first time in Bahl's career that he earned two assists in a game.

Siegenthaler logged 26:55 TOI on Tuesday at Vancouver, which marked a career-high (Prior, 26:53, Dec. 30, 2022, at PIT).

Curtis Lazar returned to Vancouver, after playing in 45 games with the Canucks last season. Lazar earned one helper, which marked his seventh point for the season. Keep in mind that Lazar earned five points (3g-2a) all of last season while playing for Vancouver and then the Devils (4 GP).

Tyler Toffoli ranks second New Jersey with 81 shots on goal in 2023-24, while J. Hughes ranks first with 87 shots.

Kevini Bahl leads Jersey with 48 hits this season.

He recorded a career-high eight hits on Sat., Nov. 18, while his prior career-high was seven hits: May 8, 2021, at NY Islanders. The eight hits are the most that a Devils skater earned this season (B. Smith, 6, Nov. 10, vs WSH), and marks the most hits that a New Jersey skater earned in a game since N. Okhotiuk on Jan. 13, 2023, at Anaheim.

Jonas Siegenthaler leads New Jersey with 40 blocks in 2023-24. John Marino rank second with 30 blocked shots this season.

TIMELESS...

Dawson Mercer has played in 187 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 187 consecutive games played currently ranks 15th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 187 consecutive games played ranks 16^{th} all-time in franchise history. He passed Zach Parise's 186 consecutive games played (12/28/07 - 2/8/10).

Tyler Toffoli has played in 153 consecutive games, which ranks 24th for all active skaters in the NHL.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Akira Schmid shined in the 2022-23 playoffs, and earned his first-career postseason shutout (vs NYR) and became the third rookie netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Swiss native was the first rookie netminder in franchise history who earned two shutouts in a single postseason.

Vanecek owns 41 career wins with New Jersey, which ranks 10th all-time in franchise history. Craig Billington ranks ninth for this matter with 43 career wins.

Schmid owns two assists for the season and his career. His two assists this season are tied with three other goaltenders for the most in the NHL.

Schmid played Philadelphia for the fourth time in his career via Thursday, Nov. 30, and recorded a shutout streak of 95:14 without a allowing a goal against Philadelphia in parts of three games played dating to Dec. 3rd, 2022.

Schmid then started again in the second half of a back-to-back on Fri., Dec. 1, vs San Jose, but suffered the loss.

Vanecek is fresh off is ninth win for the season, after a 6-5 win at Vancouver on Tuesday. The Czechia native's 42 career wins with the Devils ranks 10th all-time for franchise history. His next win will tie Craig Billington (43 wins) for ninth place all-time for Franchise history.
