WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Week

The Devils opened a five-game homestand on Sun. Dec. 17, which resulted in a 5-1 loss against Anaheim at the Rock. The team hosted Philadelphia on Tuesday, but suffered a 3-2 overtime loss. The team will play one last time before the Holiday break on Dec. 23, against Detroit, and then resume play on Dec. 27 vs Columbus.

Last Game

The Devils and Philadelphia faced-off for the second time this season, after the Flyers tied the season-series at 1-1.

The Devils skated in their fourth overtime contest for 2023-24.

The team is now 3-1 in overtime for the 2023-24 campaign.

Jersey's team netted the first goal of the game, but fell to 7-1-1 when scoring first in a contest this season. The Flyers entered Tuesday night's contest with 2-9-3 record when trailing first in a game for 2023-24.

The Devils were tied after two periods of play in a contest for the sixth time this season, but fell to 3-3-0 for this matter.

The Devils were even in shots for the first time this season (0-0-1).

The Devils logged 25 hits, which marked the sixth time this season that New Jersey logged 25, or more, hits in a game for 2023-24. The most hits that New Jersey logged in a game this season was 34 on Nov. 25, vs Buffalo.

The team won 33 faces-offs (33/54, 61%), and the Devils won 61% of face-offs in a game for the fourth time this season. The team's season-high for face-off% in a game for 2023-24 was 63.3%, which was logged on Oct. 24, at Montreal.

The team owns 30 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 30 games played (31.3%). Per Wed., Dec. 20, the team's 31.3 power-play% ranked tied for first in the NHL behind the New York Rangers (31.3%).

The team's 30 power-play goals this season ranked (tied, NYR) second in the NHL, while Tampa's 32 PPG rank first, per Wed., Dec. 20.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for seven power-play goals this season, which ranks (tied, EDM) first in the NHL.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game eight times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

The eight games which the Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals rank second (tied w/ TBL, EDM & VGK) in the NHL behind Detroit's 10.

LIGHTING THE LAMP/STREAK ENDED

The Devils streak without suffering a shutout of 101 consecutive games ended, after a 4-0 loss at Detroit on Wed., Nov. 22.

The streak dated back to Apr. 24, 2022, which was also a 3-0 loss to Detroit but at Prudential Center.

The 101 consecutive games without suffering a shutout over multiple seasons was the third-longest stretch in franchise history.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

New Jersey's 101 consecutive games without being shut out was the second-longest active streak currently in the NHL entering Wednesday, Nov. 22, contest at Detroit, while Toronto ranked first at 162 games.

The longest streak without experiencing a shutout all-time was Calgary – 264 consecutive games from Nov. 12, 1981, to Jan. 9, 1985.

IN THE DOTS

New Jersey won a season-high 39 face-offs on Tue., November 7, at Colorado. The team's season-high face-off% in 2023-24 is 63.3%, which was earned on Oct. 24, at Montreal (38/60), and then also on Nov. 2 at Minnesota (31/49).

Keep an eye on...**Michael McLeod** ranks first in the NHL for overall face-off% (65.8%), per Wed., Dec. 20.

He also ranked first for overall face-off% on the road (65.0%), and first overall face-off% at home (66.9%).

McLeod owns the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more face-offs in a GP), which was 100.0%, after McLeod won 12/12 face-offs on Dec. 17, vs Anaheim.

The effort marked the second time (since face-offs were tracked) in franchise history that a player won 100% of his face-off attempts while taking 12, or more, face-offs in a single game. The last time it happened was also McLeod, which was logged on Jan. 22, 2023, vs Pittsburgh (13/13).

McLeod then tied a career-high 16 face-off wins ((Nov. 14th's at Winnipeg), after winning 16/18 face-offs (88.9%) against Philadelphia on Tue., Dec. 19.

McLeod is 28/30 (93.3%) in the face-off circle over the team's last two games.

Nico Hischier won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which marked the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.

The Devils ranked fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.5%).

Entering Thursday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 59.3%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 850 career regular season wins, which now ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 114 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Doug Carpenter for fourth place all-time in franchise history for head coaches. Ruff's 114 career wins with New Jersey are tied with Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 250 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

THE SWISS CONNECTION

After road contest at Washington on March 9, 2023 for the first time in NHL history four Switzerland players on one team played in a game. New Jersey's **Nico Hischier**, **Timo Meier**, **Jonas Siegenthaler** and goaltender **Akira Schmid** played in the victory.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 10 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank tied for second in the NHL with Dallas (1st, NYR, 11 wins).

RUN HOME, JACK...HOME RUN, JACK!

Jack Hughes was named the NHL Third Star of the Week (week ending on Dec. 3), after No. 86 recorded seven points (3g-4a), while also posting consecutive three points games. It marked the third time in Hughes' career that he was a Star of the Week, last earned: Weeke ending on Jan. 8, 2023.

Per NHL Pr, "**Jack Hughes** recorded his 30th point and required the third fewest games in a season to reach the mark among U.S-born players, behind only **Pat LaFontaine** (11 GP in 1992-93) and **Kevin Stevens** (12 GP in 1992-93)."

Hughes also required the fewest amount of games played to reach the 30-point bench mark for franchise history. Per NHL Pr, Hughes surpassed the benchmark of 21 games (reach 30 PTS) set by **Paul Gardner** in 1977-78.

Hughes logged a career-high 27:16 TOI on Fri., Dec. 1, while his prior career-high was 26:13 TOI – vs New York Islanders on Dec. 9, 2022.

RECENT SHIFTS

Hughes became the first player in franchise history who earned a hat-trick against Columbus, after Saturday night's win at the Blue Jackets on Dec. 16.

Hughes finished the Dec. 3rd contest with three points (3g-0a), which marked the 2019 No. 1 overall selection's eighth contest with three, or more, points in a game this season. The marker tied Hughes' career-high for the most games with three, or more, points in a single season (2022-23).

The outing marked Hughes' second hat-trick career hat-trick (11/26/22, vs WSH), and first career hat-trick that he earned on the road.

Hughes owns 11 **multi-point game** for 2023-24, which leads all New Jersey skaters.

-Hughes is one of 14 NHL skaters with 11, or more, **multi-point games** in 2023-24 (1st, N. MacKinnon & N. Kucherov, 16 GP).

Hughes owns **three multi-goal game** for the 2023-24 campaign. Hughes' career-high for the most **multi-goal games** in a single season is 10, which he earned in 2022-23.

Hughes became the fastest player who earned **100 career goals** in Devils team history (since 1982-83, previously B. Gionta, 284 GP), after nodding the tally in his 267th career NHL contest with New Jersey.

-Wilf Paiement was the fastest to 100 career goals, after the forward earned the marker in 228 GP w/ the Colorado Rockies.

The most three-point games that a Devils player recorded in franchise history for a single season is 11, which Kirk Muller earned in 1987-88.

Hughes is averaging 1.52 points, per game, which sits behind N. Kucherov (1.69), and is tied with C. McDavid (1.52) for second in the NHL.

Side note... Per NHL Pr, Hughes is "one shy from becoming the second player in Devils/Scouts/Rockies history to record 60 assists in a calendar year. The only other to do so is **Kirk Muller** (61 in 1990)."

THE BRATT-MAN

Jesper Bratt (5g-13a) is one of five skaters in the NHL with 18, or more, power-play points in 2023-24.

Keep in mind that Bratt earned a career-high 22 power-play points (8g-14a) last season.

The most power-play points that a player earned in a single season for franchise history is 39, which Rob Ramage earned with Colorado in 1980-81. The most power-play points earned in Devils team history for a single season is 37, which Taylor Hall earned in 2017-18 and then Kirk Muller recorded in 1987-88.

Bratt's four game-winning goals lead New Jersey this season. The Swedish forward is one of 15 skaters this season with four, or more, game-winning goals. K. Connor & M. Duchene lead the NHL with five game-winners, per Wed., Dec. 20.

Bratt's career-high is six game-winning goals in a season, which was earned in 2021-22.

The 2016 sixth-round draft pick was riding a seven-game point streak (4g-7a), which snapped after Sun., Dec. 17, contest vs Anaheim.

Side note... Bratt has played in 116 consecutive games which ranks tied for 46th in the NHL for all active skaters.

-Bratt is two assists shy of 200 career assists. Bratt can become one of 16 skaters all-time in franchise history who earned 200, or more, career assists. D. Severson ranks 15th all-time with 205 career assists in a Devils sweater.

FINDING NEMO

Simon Nemeč logged his NHL debut on Fri., Dec. 1, vs San Jose and wasted no time inking his name onto an NHL score sheet. Nemeč collected two assists in his debut, which marked the ninth instance in franchise history that a player earned a multi-point game in their NHL debut:

Hischier is now one of 21 skaters all-time in franchise history who earned 300, or more, career points with the organization (S. Brylin, 20th, 308 career PTS).

The captain is also the sixth Switzerland native all-time who earned 300, or more, career NHL points. Fellow teammate **Timo Meier** ranks fifth all-time for this matter with 341 career points.

Dawson Mercer has played in 194 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 194 consecutive games played currently ranks (tied, C. Coyle) 13th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 194 consecutive games played ranks 11th all-time in franchise history. Scott Stevens' 196 consecutive games played from 11/23/93 to 10/5/96 ranks 10th all-time for franchise history.

Tyler Toffoli has played in 160 consecutive games, which ranks 22nd for all active skaters in the NHL.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Akira Schmid shined in the 2022-23 playoffs, and earned his first-career postseason shutout (vs NYR) and became the third rookie netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Swiss native was the first rookie netminder in franchise history who earned two shutouts in a single postseason.

Vanecek earned his 44th career win with the Devils in his most recent outing against Boston on Dec. 13 (2-1, Wot), which passed Craig Billington for ninth place all-time in franchise history. Alain Chevrier ranks eighth all-time in franchise history with 53 career wins in a Devils sweater.

Schmid is one of four goaltenders this season with two assists, and points, which leads the NHL.

Schmid is fresh off his 12th start for 2023-24, while the Swiss netminder's career-high for starts in a single season are 14 (2022-23). Schmid recorded consecutive starts and in a back-to-back set from Dec. 16 to Dec. 17 (1-1-0).
