WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Week Ahead

The Devils open their ninth back-to-back set for the 2023-24 campaign, while hosting Chicago on Friday night and then Vancouver on Saturday evening. The team then plays next on Thu., Jan. 11, at Tampa.

Last Game

The Devils skated in their first contest for 2024, which also concluded a three-game road trip that started on Fri. Dec. 29, at Ottawa (6-2, W).

The team faced-off with Washington for the third of four matchups this season (1-2-0):

Next: Feb. 20, 2024, at Washington, 7:00 P.M. E.T.

The Devils scored the first goal in the contest, which marked the 11th time this season that the Devils scored first in a game (8-2-1).

New Jersey scored six, or more, goals in a game for the fifth time this season, while the most goals that the team recorded in a game this season was seven via Nov. 25, 2023, vs Buffalo in a 7-2 win. Keep in mind that the team scored six, or more, goals in a game eight times last season.

The victory also marked New Jersey's first regulation win at Washington since January 11, 2020, which was a 5-1 win.

The Devils outshot Washington 28-26, and improved to 15-6-1 when outshooting an opponent in a game for 2023-24.

New Jersey was 39/68 (57%) on face-offs, which tied a season-high for most wins in a game, prior: 39, Nov. 7, 2023, at Colorado.

Man Advantage

The team owns 34 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 36 games played (30.6%). The team's 34 power-play goals are tied for the fourth-most in the NHL with Detroit and the NY Rangers. The team's power-play% ranks first in the NHL, per Jan. 4.

New Jersey is one of six teams with 34, or more, power-play goals this season, Tampa's 37 power-play goals ranked first in the NHL, per Jan. 4.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for seven power-play goals this season, which ranks (tied, EDM) first in the NHL.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

LIGHTING THE LAMP/STREAK ENDED

The Devils streak without suffering a shutout of 101 consecutive games ended, after a 4-0 loss at Detroit on Wed., Nov. 22.

The streak dated back to Apr. 24, 2022, which was also a 3-0 loss to Detroit but at Prudential Center.

The 101 consecutive games without suffering a shutout over multiple seasons was the third-longest stretch in franchise history.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

New Jersey's 101 consecutive games without being shut out was the second-longest active streak currently in the NHL entering Wednesday, Nov. 22, contest at Detroit, while Toronto ranked first at 162 games.

The longest streak without experiencing a shutout all-time was Calgary – 264 consecutive games from Nov. 12, 1981, to Jan. 9, 1985.

IN THE DOTS

New Jersey won 39 face-offs on Jan. 3, at Washington (39/68, 57%), which tied a season-high, prior: Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.

Keep an eye on... **Michael McLeod** ranks first in the NHL for overall face-off% (66.4%).

He also ranked first for overall face-off% on the road (67.3%), and first overall face-off% at home (65.3%), per Jan. 4.

McLeod owns the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more face-offs in a GP), which was 100.0%, after McLeod won 12/12 face-offs on Dec. 17, vs Anaheim.

The effort marked the second time (since face-offs were tracked) in franchise history that a player won 100% of his face-off attempts while taking 12, or more, face-offs in a single game. The last time it happened was also McLeod, which was logged on Jan. 22, 2023, vs Pittsburgh (13/13).

McLeod earned a career-high 17 face-off wins on Sat., Dec. 30, at Boston (17/20, 85%).

Nico Hischier won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which matched (M. McLeod) the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.

The Devils ranked third in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (54.0%).

Entering Friday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 59.7%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 854 career regular season wins, which now ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 118 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 256 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 13 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank first (tied, DAL) in the NHL, per Jan. 4

DID YOU KNOW...

The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs Chicago is eight, three times, and last logged on Jan. 14, 2019, vs Chicago at the Rock.

The most goals that the franchise allowed in a single game vs Chicago is 10, which was logged in a 10-0 loss at Chicago on Nov. 15, 1981.

The most goals that the Devils allowed in team history (since 1982-83) vs Chicago is eight, which was logged on Feb. 25, 2022, at Chicago in an 8-5 loss.

The most shots that the franchise earned in a single game vs Chicago is 45 in a 4-4 tie at Chicago on Apr. 5, 1978.

The most shots that the Devils earned in a single game since 1982-83 is 44, after a 7-1 win on Dec. 23, 2019, at Chicago.

The most shots that the franchise allowed vs the Blackhawks is 56, which was recorded on Jan. 17, 1979 at Chicago in a 2-1 loss (CLR).

The most shots that the Devils allowed in a single game vs Chicago since 1982-83 is 50, after a 5-3 loss at Chicago on Nov. 23, 1986.

The last time the Devils shut out Chicago was on Dec. 6, 2022, after a 3-0 win at the Rock (V. Vanecek, 24 saves).

The last time Chicago shut out the Devils was on Dec. 31, 1995, after a 5-0 loss at Chicago in a 5-0 loss.

PLAYER NOTES

RUN HOME, JACK...HOME RUN, JACK!

Jack Hughes was named the NHL Third Star of the Week (week ending on Dec. 3), after No. 86 recorded seven points (3g-4a), while also posting consecutive three points games. It marked the third time in Hughes' career that he was a Star of the Week, last earned: Weeke ending on Jan. 8, 2023.

Per NHL Pr, "**Jack Hughes** recorded his 30th point and required the third fewest games in a season to reach the mark among U.S-born players, behind only **Pat LaFontaine** (11 GP in 1992-93) and **Kevin Stevens** (12 GP in 1992-93)."

Hughes also required the fewest amount of games played to reach the 30-point bench mark for franchise history. Per NHL Pr, Hughes surpassed the benchmark of 21 games (reach 30 PTS) set by **Paul Gardner** in 1977-78.

The most power-play points earned in Devils team history for a single season is 37, which Taylor Hall earned in 2017-18 and then Kirk Muller recorded in 1987-88.

Bratt's four game-winning goals lead New Jersey this season.

Bratt's career-high is six game-winning goals in a season, which was earned in 2021-22.

Side note...Bratt has played in 122 consecutive games which ranks for (tied) 43rd in the NHL for all active skaters.

Kevin Bahl leads all Jersey blueliners and skaters with 70 hits, while **Nathan Bastian** lead all Devils forwards with 69 hits this season.

Bahl recorded a career-high eight hits on Sat., Nov. 18, while his prior career-high was seven hits: May 8, 2021, at NY Islanders. Mercer's 200 consecutive games played ranks 10th place all-time in franchise history, while Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games (4/7/18 – 5/10/21) ranks ninth for franchise history.

Tyler Toffoli has played in 166 consecutive games, which ranks 20th for all active skaters in the NHL.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Daws also earned his first-career NHL point, after he was credited with the secondary assist on N. Hischier's first goal of the game on Jan. 3. Daws is the third different Devils netminder who earned a points/assist this season: **A. Schmid** (0g-2a) and **V. Vanecek** (0g-1a).
