New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Week Ahead

The Devils concluded a three-game road trip, while visiting Boston for a matinee contest on Mon., Jan. 15 (3-0, L). The team suffered an overtime loss against Tampa on Thu., Jan. 11, but rebounded with a 4-1 win at Florida on Sat., Jan. 13.

The Devils host Montreal on Wed., Jan. 17, and then open the team's 10th back-to-back set for the 2023-224 campaign when the team visits Columbus on Jan. 19, and hosts Dallas on Jan. 20.

Last Game

- The Devils and Boston concluded their 2023-24 regular-season series (1-2-0), which also concluded the team's three-game road trip (1-1-1).
- The Devils entered Monday's matinee contest with an 8-3-1 record against Atlantic Division opponents this season, but fell to 8-4-1 for this matter.
- The Devils skated in their fourth matinee contest for the 2023-24 campaign and fell to 1-3-0 when playing in a day game.
- Jersey's team surrendered the game's first goal and fell to 13-14-1 when trailing first in a game this season.
- The Devils were outshot, 36-31. The team is now 6-10-0 when outshot in a game this season.

- New Jersey suffered its second shutout for the 2023-24 campaign, while Nov. 22, 2023, at Detroit (4-0, L) marked the team's
 first game shutout this season.
- The last time that the Bruins shut out New Jersey was on May 3rd, 2021, in a 3-0 loss vs Boston (T. Rask, 20 saves).
- The Devils were 30/58 (52%) on face-offs in the contest.

Man Advantage

The team owns 34 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 41 games played (27.6%). The team's 34 power-play goals rank seventh in the NHL. The team's power-play% ranks third in the NHL, per Tue., Jan. 16. Yet, the team hasn't cashed in on the man advantage in its last five gams dating to Jan. 5, vs Chicago (0/12).

New Jersey is one of seven teams with 34, or more, power-play goals this season, while Colorado's 42 power-play goals rank first in the NHL, per Jan. 16.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for seven power-play goals this season, which ranks second in the NHL, per Jan. 16. Edmonton ranked first for this matter with eight power-play goals scored from defenseman.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

LIGHTING THE LAMP/STREAK ENDED

The Devils streak without suffering a shutout of 101 consecutive games ended, after a 4-0 loss at Detroit on Wed., Nov. 22.

The streak dated back to Apr. 24, 2022, which was also a 3-0 loss to Detroit but at Prudential Center.

The 101 consecutive games without suffering a shutout over multiple seasons was the third-longest stretch in franchise history.

The team's longest stretch in franchise history over multiple seasons without experiencing a shutout against were 111 games played from Jan. 5, 1999, to Feb. 29, 2000.

New Jersey's 101 consecutive games without being shut out was the second-longest active streak currently in the NHL entering Wednesday, Nov. 22, contest at Detroit, while Toronto ranked first at 162 games.

The longest streak without experiencing a shutout all-time was Calgary – 264 consecutive games from Nov. 12, 1981, to Jan. 9, 1985.

IN THE DOTS

- New Jersey won 39 face-offs on Jan. 3, at Washington (39/68, 57%), which tied a season-high, prior: Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- Keep an eye on...Michael McLeod ranks first in the NHL for overall face-off% (65.7.%).
- He also ranked second for overall face-off% on the road (66.2%), and first overall face-off% at home (65.2%).
- McLeod owns the highest face-off percentage that a Devils skater logged this season (10 or more face-offs in a GP), which was 100.0%, after McLeod won 12/12 face-offs on Dec. 17, vs Anaheim.
- The effort marked the second time (since face-offs were tracked) in franchise history that a player won 100% of his face-off attempts while taking 12, or more, face-offs in a single game. The last time it happened was also Mcleod, which was logged on Jan. 22, 2023, vs Pittsburgh (13/13).
- McLeod earned a career-high 17 face-off wins on Sat., Dec. 30, at Boston (17/20, 85%).
- Nico Hischier won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which matched (M. McLeod) the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.
- The Devils rank fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (54.1%), while Montreal ranked fifth (54%).
- Entering Wednesdays contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 59.2%, while Montreal ranked second (56.7).

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 856 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 120 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 261 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The organization is scheduled to honor three-time Stanley Cup champion **Sergei Brylin** on Sat., Jan. 20, as the club's second Ring of Honor inductee (Dr. John J. McMullen, the Devils' first owner who brought the team to New Jersey from Colorado was the 1st inductee).

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 14 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank (tied, DAL & COL) first in the NHL, per Jan. 16.

Daws earned his first-career NHL point, after he was credited with the secondary assist on N. Hischier's first goal of the game on Jan. 3. Daws is the third different Devils netminder who earned a points/assist this season: **A. Schmid** (0g-2a) and **V. Vanecek** (0g-1a).
