New Jersey opened its 41<sup>st</sup> season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

## **LAST GAME IN DETAIL**

- The Devils and Tampa faced-off for the second of three matchups in 2023-24 (0-1-1):
- **Next: Feb. 25, 1:00 P.M. E.T. | Prudential Center**
- The team enters their bye week, which begins on Sun., Jan. 28, and resumes action on Tue., Feb. 6<sup>th</sup>, vs Colorado at Prudential Center.
- Jersey's team surrendered the game's first goal and fell to 15-18-1 when trailing first in a contest this season.
  
- The Devils were outshot 42-24, and fell to 6-12-0 when outshot in a contest for 2023-24. Tonight's outing marked the third time that the Devils allowed 40, or more, shots in a game.
- The most shots that the Devils allowed in a contest this season was 47, after a 4-3 overtime win on Nov. 30, 2023, at Philadelphia. The Devils are now 1-2-0 when allowing 40, or more, shots on goal in a game this season.
- New Jersey is now 8-6-1 against the Atlantic Division for 2023-24.

## **Man Advantage**

The team owns 36 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 47 games played (25.7%). The team's 36 power-play goals ranked 10th in the NHL, per Feb. 5. The team's power-play% ranked (tied, COL) sixth in the NHL, per Feb. 5.

New Jersey is one of 10 teams with 36, or more, power-play goals this season, while Tampa and Colorado's 47 power-play goals rank first in the NHL, per Feb. 5.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for eight power-play goals this season, which ranks tied for first in the NHL with Edmonton, per Feb. 5.

The Devils have logged two, or more, power-play goals in a game 10 times this season.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

### **LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK**

The Devils have recorded 65 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the fifth-longest stretch without being shut out in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

### IN THE DOTS

- New Jersey won 39 face-offs on Jan. 3, at Washington (39/68, 57%), which tied a season-high, prior: Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- **Nico Hischier** won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which matched (M. McLeod) the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.
- The Devils rank fifth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.9%).
- Entering Tuesday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 58.8%.

### COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11<sup>th</sup>.

Ruff owns 858 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100<sup>th</sup> career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>'s 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 122 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 267 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history.

### LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

### COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 16 comeback wins in 2023-24 ranked second in the NHL, per Jan. 26. Dallas ranked first with 17 comeback wins, while Colorado & Detroit's 15 comeback wins ranked third behind New Jersey.

Mercer's 211 consecutive games played currently ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 211 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21).

**Tyler Toffoli** has played in 177 consecutive games, which ranks tied for 19<sup>th</sup> for all active skaters in the NHL.

## BETWEEN THE PIPES

**Vitek Vanecek** recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.
