The Week Ahead

The Devils resumed action after the team's bye week and NHL All-Star break and defeated Colorado 5-3 at Prudential Center on Tue., Feb. 6. The team hosted Calgary on Thu., Feb. 8, but fell by a score of 5-3. After playing Carolina on Sat., Feb. 10, the team will host Seattle on Monday and then visit Nashville on Tuesday for a back-to-back set.

LAST GAME IN DETAIL

- The Devils and Calgary concluded their 2023-24 regular-season series (1-1-0)
- Jersey's team recorded the game's first goal and fell to 9-3-2 when scoring first in a contest this season.
- The Devils are now 9-10-1 against the Western Conference.

- The Devils were outshot Calgary 40-30, and fell to 19-9-2 when outshooting an opponent in a contest this season.
- The Devils recorded 40, or more, shots on goal in a contest for the third time this season, while the most shots on goal that the team earned in a single game was 47 (Dec. 1, 2023, vs SJS, 6-3, L).
- Jersey's team was 32/61 (52%) on face-offs.

Man Advantage

The team owns 36 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 49 games played (24.8%). The team's 36 power-play goals ranked 11th in the NHL, per Feb. 9. The team's power-play% ranked eighth in the NHL, per Feb. 9 .

New Jersey defensemen have combined for eight power-play goals this season, which ranks tied for first in the NHL with Edmonton, per Feb. 9.

The Devils have logged two, or more, power-play goals in a game 10 times this season.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK

The Devils have recorded 67 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the fifth-longest stretch without being shut out in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

IN THE DOTS

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on Tue., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, which tied the team's season-high for the most face-offs wins in a game. New Jersey also won 39 face-offs on Jan. 3, at Washington (39/68, 57%), which tied a season-high, prior: Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- **Nico Hischier** won 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose, which matched (M. McLeod) the most face-offs that a Devils skater won in a game this season.

- The Devils rank fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (54.1%).
- Entering Saturday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 59.0%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 859 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 123 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 269 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Devils are scheduled to play in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series game on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium vs the Philadelphia Flyers (8:00 P.M. E.T.). It marks the team's second Stadium Series contest (vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3 loss).

New Jersey is also slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 17 comeback wins in 2023-24 ranked (tied) first in the NHL with Dallas, per Feb. 9.

Colorado, Detroit and the NY Rangers all earned 15 comeback wins and sat behind New Jersey and Dallas for this matter.

- Bratt's career-high is six game-winning goals in a season, which was earned in 2021-22.
- Bratt recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal via Jan. 22, vs Vegas.
- *Side note...* Bratt has played in 135 consecutive games which ranks (tied) 40th in the NHL for all active skaters.
- -Bratt earned his 200th career assist, after Friday, December 29th's win at Ottawa.
 - Bratt now ranks 15th all-time in franchise history with 209 career assists (passed D. Severson).
- The Swedish forward also owns seven games with three, or more, points in 2023-24.
 - That marker noted above also marks his most three-point games in a single season (prior, 5 GP, 2021-22).
- **Jack Hughes** and **Jesper Bratt** have recorded two four-point games this season, while the most four-point games earned in a single season for franchise history is four:

Bahl recorded a career-high 10 hits on Nov. 18, 2023, vs the NY Rangers.

Bahl logged a career-high 23:37 TOI on Jan. 11, at Tampa, which led all Devils skaters in the contest.

John Marino leads New Jersey with 64 blocked shots this season. with The most blocked shots that a Devils skater earned in a single season was Andy Greene in 2018-19 with 208.

Marino also ranks first on New Jersey for ATOI (21:10).

TIMELESS...

Dawson Mercer has played in 213 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 213 consecutive games played currently ranks 13th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 213 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21).

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Vanecek owns 50 career wins with the Devils, which ranks ninth all-time for franchise history. Alain Chevrier ranks eighth all-time in franchise history with 53 career wins in a Devils sweater.

Vanecek is one of 11 NHL netminders with 17, or more, wins this season.

Nico Daws was recalled from Utica (AHL) on Dec. 27, while **Akira Schmid** was assigned to Utica (AHL) on Dec. 28.

Daws earned his first-career NHL point, after he was credited with the secondary assist on N. Hischier's first goal of the game on Jan. 3. Daws is the third different Devils netminder who earned a points/assist this season: **A. Schmid** (0g-2a) and **V. Vanecek** (0g-1a).
