WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils won their first-ever NHL outdoor game, after the team defeated Philadelphia 6-3 in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series contest on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium.

The Devils played in front of 70,328 fans at MetLife Stadium, which marked the franchise's highest attended game all-time. The team's attendance for the 2014 Stadium Series game against the New York Rangers at Yankee Stadium was 50,105.

The Week Ahead

The Devils are slated for four games in six days, which begins on Tue., Feb. 20, at Washington. Jersey's team then returns to the Garden State for a three-game homestand starting on Thursday against the Broadway Blueshirts. The Devils then host Montreal and Tampa for a back-to-to-back set via Saturday and Sunday (matinee contests).

LAST GAME IN DETAIL

- The Devils and the City of Brotherly Love met for the third time this season (2-0-1):
 - **Next: April, 13, at Philadelphia | 5:00 P.M. E.T.**
- New Jersey played in its second-ever outdoor contest (Jan. 26, 2014, vs NYR, at Yankee Stadium, 7-3, L), and won the team's first-ever NHL outdoor game.
- Per NHL Pr, "MetLife Stadium will join Yankee Stadium (2014) and Edgewood Tahoe Resort (2021) as the third venue to host multiple NHL outdoor games in the same season. It will be the sixth venue to host multiple NHL outdoor games at any point."

"New Jersey will be the 17th U.S. state to host at least one regular-season outdoor game, and the seventh to host multiple following New York (4: 2008 WC, 2 at 2014 SS & 2018 WC), Pennsylvania (4: 2011 WC, 2012 WC, 2017 SS & 2019 SS), Massachusetts (2: 2010 WC & 2023 WC), Illinois (2: 2009 WC & 2014 SS), Minnesota (2: 2016 SS & 2022 WC) and Nevada (2 at 2021 LT)."

- Jersey's team is now 11-3-2 when scoring first in a contest this season.
- The Devils earned six, or more, goals in a game for the sixth time this season.

- The Devils were outshot 48-40, and improved to 8-13-0 when outshot in a contest this season.
- Jersey's team was 39/65 (60%) on face-offs. The 39 face-offs wins tied a season-high.
- Per NHL Pr, " The Devils tallied twice in a span of 1:12, marking the [eighth-fastest two goals by a team in an outdoor game](#) and quickest since the Bruins during 2021 NHL Outdoors at Lake Tahoe (1:06 & 0:33)."

Man Advantage

The Devils have recorded a power-play goal in two of the team's last four games played.

The team owns 38 power-play goals in 2023-24, after 53 games played (22.9%). The team's 38 power-play goals ranked (tied) 11th in the NHL, per Feb. 19. The team's power-play% ranked 13th in the NHL, per Feb. 19.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for eight power-play goals this season, which ranks second in the NHL behind Edmonton (9), per Feb. 19.

The Devils have logged two, or more, power-play goals in a game 10 times this season.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK

The Devils have recorded 70 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the fifth-longest stretch without being shut out in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

IN THE DOTS

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia on Sat., Feb. 17, which tied a season-high.
 - Also: Feb. 6, vs Colorado; Jan. 3, at Washington; Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- **Nico Hischier** won 18 face-offs in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia, which marked a season-high for all Devils skaters.
 - Hischier's 18 face-offs wins surpassed the team's prior season-high: Hischier's 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose.
- The Devils rank fifth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.9%).
- Entering Tuesday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 58.0%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 862 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 126 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 274 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history. Doug Carpenter ranks third in franchise history with 290 regular-season games coached.

Ruff has coached in one outdoor game, which was the NHL's first-ever Winter Classic. Ruff was head coach of Buffalo at the time when the Sabres hosted Pittsburgh at Ralph Wilson Stadium (NFL's Buffalo Bills) on January 1, 2008.

LOOKING AHEAD

New Jersey is slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The team is scheduled for 15 games during the month of March, which marks New Jersey's highest total number of a games for a single month this season (2nd, December, 14 GP).

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 18 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank tied for first in the NHL with Dallas and NY Rangers, per Feb. 19.

DID YOU KNOW...

- The most goals in franchise history earned in a single game vs Washington is eight, which was logged by the Colorado Rockies on Oct. 28, 1977, in an 8-1 win vs Washington.
- The most goals in Devils team history earned in a single game vs Washington is seven, twice, and last logged on Dec. 28, 2005, in a 7-2 win at Jersey.
- The most goals that the franchise allowed in a single game vs Washington was nine, four times, and last recorded on Jan. 1, 1993, in a 9-2 loss at Washington.

- The most shots that the franchise earned in a single game vs Washington was 47 on Jan. 20, 1989, in a 6-5 win at Washington.
- The most shots that the franchise allowed in a single game vs Washington was 51 on Nov. 18, 1980, in a 7-1 loss at Washington.
- The most shots that the Devils (team history) allowed in a single game vs Washington was 47 on Apr. 10, 1993, in a 5-3 win at the Caps.

- The last time that the Devils shut out Washington was on Oct. 11, 2018, in a 6-0 win (K. Kinkaid, 21 saves).
- The last time that Washington shut out the Devils was on Mar. 26, 2021, in a 4-0 loss at Washington (I. Samsonov, 24 saves).
- The Devils and Washington met in the Stanley Cup Playoffs twice, and last met in the postseason during the 1989-90 Division Semi-Finals – WSH eliminated NJD in six games.

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Vanecek owns 50 career wins with the Devils, which ranks ninth all-time for franchise history. Alain Chevrier ranks eighth all-time in franchise history with 53 career wins in a Devils sweater.

Nico Daws was recalled from Utica (AHL) on Dec. 27, while **Akira Schmid** was assigned to Utica (AHL) on Dec. 28.

Daws earned his first-career NHL point, after he was credited with the secondary assist on N. Hischier's first goal of the game on Jan. 3. Daws is the third different Devils netminder who earned a points/assist this season: **A. Schmid** (0g-2a) and **V. Vanecek** (0g-1a).
