WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils won their first-ever NHL outdoor game, after the team defeated Philadelphia 6-3 in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series contest on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium.

The Devils played in front of 70,328 fans at MetLife Stadium, which marked the franchise's highest attended game all-time. The team's attendance for the 2014 Stadium Series game against the New York Rangers at Yankee Stadium was 50,105.

The Week Ahead

The Devils traveled to the West Coast and face-off against all three Golden State teams. Jersey's team hits the Shark Tank first in San Jose on Tuesday, and then visits the Pond against the Ducks on Friday. The team's three-game road trip concludes on Sunday at Los Angeles.

LAST GAME IN DETAIL

- The Devils and Tampa concluded their 2023-24 regular-season series (0-2-1):
 - **Nov. 11, 2023, at Tampa, 4-3, OTL**
 - **Jan. 27, 2024, at Tampa, 6-3, L**
- The Devils are played in their 12th back-to-back set for 2023-24 and improved to 11-1-0 in the first half of back-to-back sets via Saturday's win. New Jersey is now 2-9-1 in the second half of back-to-back sets this season.
- Jersey's team fell to 18-22-2 when trailing first in a game for the 2023-24 campaign.
- The Devils were outshot 27-19 and fell to 9-14-0 when outshot in a contest this season.
- Today's contest marked the third time this season that the team did not record 20, or more, shots on goal. The fewest shots that New Jersey logged in a game this season was 16 via Nov. 22, 2023, in a 4-0 loss at Detroit.
- Jersey's team was 28/49 (57%) on face-offs.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK

The Devils have recorded 73 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the fifth-longest stretch without being shut out in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

IN THE DOTS

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia on Sat., Feb. 17, which tied a season-high.
 - Also: Feb. 6, vs Colorado; Jan. 3, at Washington; Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- **Nico Hischier** won 18 face-offs in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia, which marked a season-high for all Devils skaters.
 - Hischier's 18 face-off wins surpassed the team's prior season-high: Hischier's 17 face-offs (17/22) on Dec. 1, vs San Jose.
- The Devils rank second in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (54.3%).
- Entering Tuesday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 58.2%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach **Lindy Ruff** enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 863 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 127 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 278 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history. Doug Carpenter ranks third in franchise history with 290 regular-season games coached.

LOOKING AHEAD

New Jersey is slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The team is scheduled for 15 games during the month of March, which marks New Jersey's highest total number of a games for a single month this season (2nd, December, 14 GP).

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 19 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank first in the NHL.
