WHAT TO KNOW

New Jersey opened its 41st season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils won their first-ever NHL outdoor game, after the team defeated Philadelphia 6-3 in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series contest on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium.

The Devils played in front of 70,328 fans at MetLife Stadium, which marked the franchise's highest attended game all-time. The team's attendance for the 2014 Stadium Series game against the New York Rangers at Yankee Stadium was 50,105.

The Week Ahead

The Devils traveled to the West Coast and face-off against all three Golden State teams. Jersey's team defeated San Jose at the Shark Tank on Tuesday (7-2, W), and then visited the Pond against the Ducks on Friday (4-3, L). The team's three-game road trip concludes on Sunday at Los Angeles. New Jersey then opens a three-game homestand, which starts on Tue., Mar. 5, vs Florida.

LAST GAME IN DETAIL

- The Devils and Anaheim concluded their 2023-24 regular-season series (0-2-0):
- Dec. 17, 2023, 5-1, L | Prudential Center
- The last time that Anaheim swept the Devils in a regular-season series was 2018-19 (0-1-1).
- The team completed its second game of a three-game road trip in the Golden state, which concludes on Sun., Mar. 3, at Los Angeles for a matinee contest (3:30 P.M. E.T.).
- Jersey's team fell to 19-23-2 when trailing first in a game for the 2023-24 campaign.
- The Devils outshot Anaheim, 55-23. The team fell to 21-12-3 when outshooting an opponent this season. The 55 shots marked a season-high for the team, while the prior the Devils' season-high was 47 shots on goal (earned twice, last logged on Feb. 13, at NSH, 4-2, W).
- The 55 shots on goal marked the second most that the Devils earned in a single game in franchise history. The most shots on goal that the franchise earned in a single regular-season game was 57, which the Devils earned on Apr. 12, 1999, vs the New York Islanders in a 4-2 loss at the Meadowlands.
- Jersey's team was 38/71 (54%) on face-offs.
- New Jersey announced on Mar. 1, that the team acquired forward Kurtis MacDermid via trade from the Colorado Avalanche in exchange for a 2024 seventh-round draft pick and (prospect) Zakhar Bardakov's rights.
- The team also reassigned **Brian Halonen** to Utica (AHL) on Mar. 1.
- New Jersey began the game with a lineup of 11 forwards and seven defensemen for the consecutive contests.
- New Jersey logged two, or more, power-play goals in a game for the 11th time this season. The team's 10 games with 10 multiple power-play goal games ranked in the top 10 for all NHL teams entering the contest.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17th time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, powerplay goals in a game four times last season.

IN THE DOTS

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia on Sat., Feb. 17, which tied a season-high.
 Also: Feb. 6, vs Colorado; Jan. 3, at Washington; Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- Nico Hischier won 18 face-offs for the third time this season after Fri., Mar. 1, contest at Anaheim, which tied his season/team-high for 2023-24.
 - Since Feb. 3, 2024, Hischier's face-off% (62.0%) ranks second in the NHL behind B. Horvat (63.6%) for skaters who've taken 100, or more, face-offs.
- The Devils rank second in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (54.3%).
- Entering Sunday's's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 58.3%.

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach Lindy Ruff enters his fourth season with New Jersey, after he signed a multi-year contract extension on Wednesday, October 11th.

Ruff owns 864 career regular season wins, which ranks fourth all-time for all NHL head coaches. He passed Ken Hitchcock (849 wins) for sole possession of fourth place for all-time wins that an NHL head coach earned. Barry Trotz ranks third all-time for the most wins that an NHL head coach earned with 914.

Ruff earned his 100th career regular-season win with New Jersey, after Oct. 20th's 5-4 overtime victory at the NY Islanders. His 100 career wins with New Jersey tied him with Doug Carpenter (1985-1988) for the fourth most wins that a head coach earned with the franchise.

Ruff owns 128 career wins with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the third most wins that a head coach earned all-time for franchise history. (2nd, J. Hynes, 150 wins).

Ruff has coached 280 regular-season games with New Jersey, which passed Peter Deboer for the fourth most games coached all-time in franchise history. Doug Carpenter ranks third in franchise history with 290 regular-season games coached.

LOOKING AHEAD

New Jersey is slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The team is scheduled for 15 games during the month of March, which marks New Jersey's highest total number of a games for a single month this season (2nd, December, 14 GP).

COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The team's 20 comeback wins in 2023-24 rank first in the NHL, per Mar. 2.

The Devils witnessed three defensemen score against San Jose on Feb. 27, at San Jose: **Kevin Bahl, Brendan Smith & Colin Miller**, which marked the 10th time in franchise history that three defensemen scored in the same game. The franchise has never witnessed four different defenseman score in the same game.

The last time that the Devils witnessed three defensemen score in the same gam ewas Oct. 30, 2022, vs Columbus: R. Graves, John Marino & Jonas Siegenthaler.

Erik Haula was 15/19 on face-offs (79%) on Tue., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, yet Haula's career-high is 19 face-offs which were earned on Oct. 13, 2022, at Philadelphia (82.6%).

Haula recorded a career-high eight hits via Tue., Dec. 19, vs Philadelphia. His prior career-high for hits in a single game was four (12 times).

Haula tied a season-high six shots on goal in a game via Sat., Jan. 20 contest vs Dallas.

Jonas Siegenthaler's next contest marks his 300th career NHL game played, and he'll become the fifth Swiss-born defensemen who earned the feat.

Tyler Toffoli ranks third on New Jersey with 176 shots, while Jack Hughes ranks first with 215 shots (2nd, J. Bratt, 189 SOG).

Bahl leads Jersey with 79 blocks this season.

Marino also ranks second on New Jersey for ATOI (21:01), while Luke Hughes ranks first on New Jersey for ATOI (21:15).

Dawson Mercer has played in 224 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 224 consecutive games played currently ranks (tied) 11th in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 224 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21).

BETWEEN THE PIPES

Vitek Vanecek recorded 33 wins last season and become the second netminder in franchise history who earned 30, or more, wins in a single season. Prior to 2022-23, Martin Brodeur was the only netminder in franchise history who earned 30-or-more wins in a single season with the Devils, which he logged 14 times.

Vanecek owns 50 career wins with the Devils, which ranks ninth all-time for franchise history. Alain Chevrier ranks eighth all-time in franchise history with 53 career wins in a Devils sweater.

Vanecek is one of 16 NHL netminders with 17, or more, wins this season.

Nico Daws was recalled from Utica (AHL) on Dec. 27, while Akira Schmid was assigned to Utica (AHL) on Dec. 28.

Daws earned his first-career NHL point, after he was credited with the secondary assist on N. Hischier's first goal of the game on Jan. 3. Daws is the third different Devils netminder who earned a points/assist this season: **A. Schmid** (0g-2a) and **V. Vanecek** (0g-1a).

The 2023-24 campaign marks the fourth time in franchise history that three, or more, netminders recorded a point in a single season for the Devils:

Vanecek's 91 career wins ranks eighth all-time for Czechia-born netminders. Michal Neuvirth ranks seventh with 105 career wins.

Nico Daws recorded his fourth consecutive start, after earning the win against Philadelphia at MetLife on Saturday. Not only did Daws face the most shots against (48) for any NHL outdoor game, but the youngster also recorded the most saves (45) for any goaltender in an NHL outdoor game (Prior: D. Rittich, 43 saves).

Per NHL Pr, "Nico Daws became the third rookie netminder to earn an NHL outdoor game win joining Matt Murray (2017 SS w/ PIT) and Mike Condon (2016 WC w/ MTL)."

Akira Schmid rejoined New Jersey and started the team's contest on Sun., Feb. 25, which marked the youngster's first start with New Jersey since Dec. 21, 2023, vs EDM.

Schmid replaced Daws for the start of the third period on Fri., Mar. 1, at Anaheim.
