# **WHAT TO KNOW**

New Jersey opened its 41<sup>st</sup> season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils won their first-ever NHL outdoor game, after the team defeated Philadelphia 6-3 in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series contest on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium.

The Devils played in front of 70,328 fans at MetLife Stadium, which marked the franchise's highest attended game all-time. The team's attendance for the 2014 Stadium Series game against the New York Rangers at Yankee Stadium was 50,105.

Travis Green logged his head coaching (interim) debut with New Jersey on Mar. 5, 2024, after the team announced that Green was named Interim Head Coach on Mon., Mar. 4, 2024. Green is the 20<sup>th</sup> head coach in team history.

The Devils executed four trades at the NHL Trade Deadline:

Acquired a 2025 second-round draft pick & 2024 third-round draft pick from WPG in exchange for Tyler Toffoli

Acquired goaltender Jake Allen from MTL in exchange for a conditional 2025 third-round draft pick

Acquired goaltender Kaapo Kahkonen from SJS in exchange for netminder Vitek Vanecek and New Jersey's 2025 seventhround draft pick.

Acquired 2026 fourth-round draft pick from WPG in exchange for Colin Miller.

The Devils opened a three-game homestand, which began on Tue., Mar. 19 (5-2, W) and concludes on Sat., Mar. 23, against Ottawa. The Devils then travel to UBS Arena for a 5:00 P.M. E.T. puck drop against the New York Islanders on Sunday.

- The Devils earned a two-game winning streak, after the win tonight. The team is now 2-0-0 on the three game homestand, which concludes on Saturday vs Ottawa.
- Jersey's team improved to 14-5-2 when scoring first in a contest for 2023-24.
- The Devils are now 5-5-2 when tied after two periods of play in a game this season.
- The Devils outshot Winnipeg, 41-19. The contest marked the ninth time that New Jersey earned 40, or more, shots on goal in a game for 2023-24. The team's season-high was 55 shots via Mar. 1, 2024, at Anaheim in a 4-3 loss.
- The Devils were 38/61 on face-offs (62%). The team's season-high for face-off wins is 39 in a game, which the team earned four times this season.
- The Devils scored three power-play goals, which marked the 13th time the team recorded multiple power-play goals in a contest this season. It also marked the third time that the team earned three, or more, power-play goals in a game for 2023-24 (last: Nov. 2, 2023, at MIN).
- The Devils witnessed three players who earned a three-point effort in tonight's victory, which is tied for the most Devils players who earned three points in a game this season (last: **Dec. 29, 2023, at OTT**; J. Bratt, L. Hughes & J. Hughes).

New Jersey defensemen have combined for eight power-play goals this season, which ranks second (tied, NSH) in the NHL behind Edmonton (9), per Mar. 22.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, powerplay goals in a game four times last season.

#### LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK

#### IN THE DOTS

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia on Sat., Feb. 17, which tied a season-high.
   Also: Feb. 6, vs Colorado; Jan. 3, at Washington; Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- Nico Hischier won 18 face-offs for the third time this season after Fri., Mar. 1, contest at Anaheim, which tied his season/team-high for 2023-24.
- The Devils rank fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.6%), per March 22.
- Entering Saturday's contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 56.8%.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

New Jersey is slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The team is scheduled for 15 games during the month of March, which marks New Jersey's highest total number of a games for a single month this season (2<sup>nd</sup>, December, 14 GP).

#### COMEBACK KIDS

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The Devils are one of five teams with 21, or more, comeback wins this season.

Colorado has earned 23 comeback victories this season (most in the NHL).

- **Timo Meier's** five game goal-scoring streak, and points streak, ended after Mon., Mar. 11, game at the Rangers.
- The five-game goal-scoring streak tied a career-high, which he's earned three times.
  - The last time Meier earned a five-game goal-scoring streak was Dec. 17, 2022, to Dec. 27 (6g-3a).
- Meier became the third different Devils player who earned a hat-trick in 2023-24, after Thu., Mar. 7 contest vs St. Louis:

- The four hat-tricks in 2023-24 are the most that the Devils have earned in a single season since 2000-01 when the team recorded six hat-tricks. The six hat-tricks that season are tied (1987-88) for the most in franchise history for a single campaign.

- Meier is fresh off a three-point effort (1g-2a), which marked his second game with three, or more, points in a game this season (last: 4 PTS, 3g-1a, Mar. 7, 2024, vs STL).
  - Meier now owns 14 PTS (10g-4a) in his last 10 games played dating to Mar. 3, 2024, at Los Angeles.
  - o Meier's 11 goals in March ranks first for all NHL skaters, per Mar. 22.
    - The most goals scored in March for a single season is Stephane Richer who earned 13 in 1993-94.

- Per NHL Pr, "Dawson Mercer opened the scoring with his 62nd career goal; he is one of eight player in Devils *team history* with 60-plus career goals before their 23rd birthday. The others: Kirk Muller (128), Jack Hughes (108), Pat Verbeek (98), Brendan Shanahan (88), John MacLean (70), Petr Sykora (68) and Nico Hischier (63)."

#### **QUICK HITS**

**Tomas Nosek** not only earned his first assist in a Devils sweater on Tue., Mar. 19,, but his first multi-point game since joining the Devils in 2023-24. The effort marked Nosek's first muti-point game since Apr. 11, 2023, as a member of Boston against Washington (1g-1a).

**Brendan Smith** logged a career-high 27:00 TOI, after Tue., Mar. 19, contest vs Pittsburgh, while his prior career-high was 26:14 against Pittsburgh in 2013-2014 with Detroit.

**Nick DeSimone** logged his Devils debut on Thursday at Dallas, after he was claimed off waivers from Calgary on Jan. 25. He also inked his name onto the score sheet and earned his first point in a Devils sweater.

DeSimone became the 115<sup>th</sup> player in Devils team history since 1982-83 who earned a point in their debut with the team. Before tonight's contest, the last Devils player who scored in their debut with the team was Justin Dowling on Jan. 25, 2024, at Carolina.

Additionally, DeSimone logged a career-high 24:57 TOI in a game, while his prior career-high was 15:37 TOI via Nov. 16, 2023, vs Vancouver.

DeSimone then earned is first goal in a Devils sweater on Sat., Mar. 16, at Arizona. ). The effort marked the second time in the blueliner's career that he earned points in consecutive games (last: Nov. 23, 2023, to Nov. 7, 0g-3a, w/ CGY).

Chris Tierney earned his second goal of the season on Thur., Mar. 14 at Dallas.

Tierney earned his first multi-point effort (1g-1a) in a Devils sweater via Thursday at Dallas, and his first multi-point game since Mar. 7, 2023, with Montreal against Carolina (0g-2a).

Kurtis MacDermid earned his first helper, and third point, for the 2023-24 season after he was credited with the primary assist on Tierney's first-period goal on Thu., Mar. 14, at Dallas. The helper also marked his first point with the Devils since he was acquired via trade from Colorado on Mar. 1.

After Sat., Mar. 16, contest at Arizona, he logged his first fighting major (J. Brown) since joining New Jersey on Mar. 1. Curtis Lazar played in his 500<sup>th</sup> career NHL game on Tue., Feb. 13, at Nashville.

Jonas Siegenthaler played in his 300<sup>th</sup> career NHL game on Sun., Mar. 3, at Los Angeles.

John Marino earned his 100<sup>th</sup> career point, after collecting an assist on N. Hischier's third-period goal on Feb. 17.

Marino earned his first game-winning goal of the season (17:43, 3<sup>rd</sup> period) on Tues., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, which also marked the blueliner's second-career game-winning goal.

The Devils witnessed three defensemen score against San Jose on Feb. 27, at San Jose: **Kevin Bahl, Brendan Smith & Colin Miller**, which marked the 10<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history that three defensemen scored in the same game. The franchise has never witnessed four different defenseman score in the same game.

The last time that the Devils witnessed three defensemen score in the same gam was Oct. 30, 2022, vs Columbus: R. Graves, John Marino & Jonas Siegenthaler.

Erik Haula was 15/19 on face-offs (79%) on Tue., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, yet Haula's career-high is 19 face-off wins which were earned on Oct. 13, 2022, at Philadelphia (82.6%).

Haula recorded a career-high eight hits via Tue., Dec. 19, vs Philadelphia. His prior career-high for hits in a single game was four (12 times).

Haula tied a season-high six shots on goal in a game via Mon., Mar. 1, at Anaheim.

Jack Hughes ranks first on New Jersey with 247 shots (2<sup>nd</sup>, J. Bratt, 222 SOG).

Kevini Bahl leads all Jersey blueliners with 137 hits, while Curtis Lazar (166) leads all Devils skaters this season.

Bahl recorded a career-high 10 hits on Nov. 18, 2023, vs the NY Rangers.

Bahl logged a career-high 23:37 TOI on Jan. 11, at Tampa, which led all Devils skaters in the contest.

Bahl leads Jersey with 93 blocks this season, while Simon Nemec ranks second with 87 blocks.

Nemec's 5.41 blocks, per 60:00 ranks first in franchise history for all rookie blueliners in a single season (since 2005-06).

*Keep in mind...*The most blocks that a rookie skater earned in team history for a single season is Johnny Oduya who earned 119 in 2006-07.

John Marino ranks second on New Jersey for ATOI (21:13), while Luke Hughes ranks first on New Jersey for ATOI (21:17).

#### TIMELESS...

**Dawson Mercer** has played in 234 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 234 consecutive games played currently ranks (tied) 11<sup>th</sup> in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 234 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21).

# **BETWEEN THE PIPES**

**Nico Daws** recorded four consecutive starts, after earning the win against Philadelphia at MetLife on Saturday. Not only did Daws face the most shots against (48) for any NHL outdoor game, but the youngster also recorded the most saves (45) for any goaltender in an NHL outdoor game (Prior: D. Rittich, 43 saves).

Per NHL Pr, "Nico Daws became the third rookie netminder to earn an NHL outdoor game win joining Matt Murray (2017 SS w/ PIT) and Mike Condon (2016 WC w/ MTL)."

Kaapo Kahkonen became the third Finnish netminder who played in a game in franchise history:

#### Hannu Kamppuri: New Jersey Devils: 1984-85: 13 GP

Jake Allen logged his Devils debut on Thu., Mar. 14, at Dallas, and logged 35 saves on 37 shots against. He also turned away all six shots he faced on the team's penalty-kill.

Per NHL Pr, "Allen became the fifth (Devils) goaltender in the past 10 years to record a win in their team debut, joining **Nico Daws** (Oct. 23, 2021 vs BUF), **Jonathan Bernier** (Oct. 15, 2021 vs CHI), **Eric Comrie** (Jan. 31, 2021 at BUF) and **Scott Wedgewood** (March 20, 2016 vs CBJ)."

Allen logged his second start with New Jersey on Sun., Mar. 17, at Vegas.

Allen denied all 14 shots that he faced in the first period and then all 11 shots against in the second period at Vegas. Allen recorded 58 consecutive saves dating to the first period against Dallas before allowing a goal 2:57 into the third period against Vegas today. The veteran netminder logged a shutout sequence of 90:53 dating to the Dallas game on Thu., Mar. 14.

The longest shutout sequence that a Devils netminder recorded this season was **Akira Schmid**, who logged a shutout sequence of 99:21 from Nov. 24, 2023, to Nov 30, 2023, and over the span of three games played (52 saves).

Allen's longest career shutout sequence is 184:38 via Oct. 23, 2014, to Nov. 6, 2014.

Allen owned a .946 save percentage in his first three games with the team, which is the fourth-highest save percentage of any goalie through their first three appearances with the Devils franchise (at any point in their career).

Allen's 105 saves after his first three games played since joining the Devils were the most for any goaltender after their first three appearances with the franchise.

In four games with Jersey, the veteran netminder owns a .946 save% and 1.76 GAA.
