## **WHAT TO KNOW**

---

New Jersey opened its 41<sup>st</sup> season since relocating to the Garden State from Colorado in 1982-83.

New Jersey earned a franchise record 52 wins and 112 points in the standings last season.

Jersey's team tied a franchise record 28 road wins (28-9-4) last season. Prior to 2023-24, the team won 28 road games (28-10-3) in 1998-99.

The Devils won their first-ever NHL outdoor game, after the team defeated Philadelphia 6-3 in the 2024 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series contest on Sat., Feb. 17, at MetLife Stadium.

The Devils played in front of 70,328 fans at MetLife Stadium, which marked the franchise's highest attended game all-time. The team's attendance for the 2014 Stadium Series game against the New York Rangers at Yankee Stadium was 50,105.

Travis Green logged his head coaching (interim) debut with New Jersey on Mar. 5, 2024, after the team announced that Green was named Interim Head Coach on Mon., Mar. 4, 2024. Green is the 20<sup>th</sup> head coach in team history.

### The Week Ahead

The Devils concluded a three-game homestand on Sat., March 23, vs Ottawa (5-2, L) and finished the stand with a 2-1-0 record. New Jersey began a three-game road trip on Sunday at the New York Islanders (4-0, W). The team then travels North of the Border to visit Toronto on Tuesday and then at Buffalo on Fri., Mar. 29.

- The Devils began a three-game road trip which resumes on Tuesday at Toronto and then concludes on Fri., Mar. 29, at Buffalo.
- The Devils are now 3-10-1 in the second half games played for back-to-back sets this season. Jersey is now 14-13-1 overall for back-to-back sets in 2023-24.
- Jersey's team improved to 15-5-2 when scoring first in a contest this season.
- The Devils were outshot 36-30, and improved to 11-19-0 when outshot in a contest this season.
- The Devils were 32/57 on face-offs (57%). The team's season-high for face-off wins is 39 in a game, which the team earned four times this season.
- New York's Anders Lee was served a game misconduct penalty (ejected) in the second period, after a major PIM (knee) against the captain **Nico Hischier**. The captain left for the locker room late in the second period, but returned to action for the start of the third period.
- New Jersey earned its first shutout victory for 2023-24, which marked the team's first shutout since Mar. 12, 2023, in a 3-0 win vs Carolina.

The Devils recorded two power-plays in their contest against Pittsburgh on Mar. 19, and then three power-play goals on Thu., Mar. 21 against Winnipeg.

The effort against Winnipeg marked the third time that New Jersey earned three, or more, power-play goals in a game this season (last: Nov. 2, at MIN).

The Devils also recorded multi-power-play goal games in consecutive contests for the third time this season, after the Mar. 19 and Mar. 21 contest, which ended on Saturday vs Ottawa.

New Jersey defensemen have combined for eight power-play goals this season, which ranks second (tied, NSH) in the NHL behind Edmonton (9) and Ottawa (9) per Mar. 25.

The Devils recorded four power-play goals in a game for the 17<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history, after the team's 5-4 overtime win vs NY Islanders on Oct. 20. The last time that the team scored four power-play goals in a game was March 1, 2014 at the New York Islanders in a 6-1 victory.

The most power-play goals that the franchise scored in a game was six, which was logged on Feb. 19, 1980, (CLR) vs Philadelphia in an 8-6 win at Colorado.

The most power-play goals earned in a game for Devils team history is five, which Jersey's team logged three times, last recorded: Jan. 22, 2008, at Philadelphia (7-3 win).

The Devils recorded two, or more, power-play goals in a game nine times this season, while Jersey's team earned two, or more, power-play goals in a game four times last season.

### **LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK**

The Devils have recorded 79 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the fourth-longest stretch without being shut out at home in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

### **IN THE DOTS**

- The Devils won 39 face-offs on in the Stadium Series contest vs Philadelphia on Sat., Feb. 17, which tied a season-high.
  - Also: Feb. 6, vs Colorado; Jan. 3, at Washington; Nov. 7, 2023, at COL.
- **Nico Hischier** won 18 face-offs for the third time this season after Fri., Mar. 1, contest at Anaheim, which tied his season/team-high for 2023-24.
- The Devils rank fourth in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.7%).
- Entering Tuesdays contest, the Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 57.0%.

## **LOOKING AHEAD**

New Jersey is slated for 16 back-to-back sets this season, which are the most back-to-back games in the NHL for 2023-24. Washington and Minnesota rank second for this matter with 15 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 campaign.

The team is scheduled for 15 games during the month of March, which marks New Jersey's highest total number of a games for a single month this season (2<sup>nd</sup>, December, 14 GP).

## **COMEBACK KIDS**

New Jersey led the NHL with 26 comeback wins last season, which set a new franchise record. The team passed the 2017-18 team's 23 comeback wins, which was the previous franchise record in a single season.

Per NHL Pr, the most comeback wins in a single season for NHL history is shared by the Panthers (29 in 2021-22) and Lightning (29 in 2018-19).

The Devils are one of five teams with 21, or more, comeback wins this season.

Colorado has earned 25 comeback victories this season (most in the NHL).

- The Veteran forward earned his fourth multi-point game for 2023-24, after he logged two assists in the Stadium Series contest.
  - Lazar's four multi-point games are a career-high (prior: 2, 2021-22) for a single season.
- Lazar logged his first fighting major for 2023-24 on Mar. 1, at Anaheim.
  - He also logged his first career misconduct penalty (instigator)

- **Ondrej Palat's** three-game point streak (3g-2a) ended, after Sat., Feb. 10, contest at Carolina.
  - Palat netted his first multi-goal game for 2023-24 on Thu., Feb. 8, vs Calgary.
  - The three-game point streak also Palat's season-high stretch (Nov. 16, to Nov. 18, 1g-2a).
  - Palat's longest point streak since joining the Devils last season is four games (Feb. 6, 2023, to Feb. 14, 2g-4a).
- Palat earned his sixth multi-point game (0g-2a), after he and **Tomas Nosek** both contributed towards **Dawson Mercer's** multi-goal game on Tue., Mar. 19, vs Pittsburgh.
- Eighteen of Palat's 29 points this season were recorded on home ice.

- **Timo Meier** returned to San Jose on Feb. 27, and for the first time since New Jersey acquired him via trade last season.
  - The veteran forward earned two helpers in the return back to the Shark Tank.
- Meier recorded a season-high nine shots on goal via Fri., Mar. 1, at Anaheim.
  - Meier's career-high for shots on goal in a single game is 10, which he recorded at Anaheim on Jan. 6, 2023.
- Meier scored 0:15 into Sun., Mar. 3, contest at Los Angeles, which is tied for the 12th fastest goal from the start of a game in franchise history.
  - The fastest goal scored from the start of a game in franchise history is 0:08, which occurred three times, but last happened on March 9, 1993 – Alexander Semak at Vancouver.
- **Timo Meier's** five game goal-scoring streak, and points streak, ended after Mon., Mar. 11, game at the Rangers.
- The five-game goal-scoring streak tied a career-high, which he's earned three times.
  - The last time Meier earned a five-game goal-scoring streak was Dec. 17, 2022, to Dec. 27 (6g-3a).
- Meier became the third different Devils player who earned a hat-trick in 2023-24, after Thu., Mar. 7 contest vs St. Louis:
  - Tyler Toffoli, Oct. 24, 2023, at MTL
  - Jack Hughes, Dec. 16, 2023, at CBJ
  - Tyler Toffoli, Jan. 22, 2024, vs VGK
- The four hat-tricks in 2023-24 are the most that the Devils have earned in a single season since 2000-01 when the team recorded six hat-tricks. The six hat-tricks that season are tied (1987-88) for the most in franchise history for a single campaign.

  - Meier now owns 14 PTS (9g-5a) in his last 10 games played dating to Mar. 7, 2024, vs St. Louis.
  - Meier’s 12 goals in March ranks first for all NHL skaters (K. Kaprizov, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 10g).

**Alexander Holtz** played in his 100<sup>th</sup> career NHL game on Sun., Mar. 24, at NY Islanders and became the 22<sup>nd</sup> player in franchise history who scored a goal in their 100<sup>th</sup> career contest (last: Y. Sharangovich, Feb. 25, 2022, at CHI).

**Kurtis MacDermid** logged his second fighting major (M. Kastelic). on Sat., Mar. 23, since joining New Jersey on Mar. 1, 2024.

MacDermid earned his first helper, and third point, for the 2023-24 season after he was credited with the primary assist on Tierney’s first-period goal on Thu., Mar. 14, at Dallas. The helper also marked his first point with the Devils since he was acquired via trade from Colorado on Mar. 1.

DeSimone then earned his first goal in a Devils sweater on Sat., Mar. 16, at Arizona. ). The effort marked the second time in the blueliner's career that he earned points in consecutive games (last: Nov. 23, 2023, to Nov. 7, 0g-3a, w/ CGY).

**Curtis Lazar** played in his 500<sup>th</sup> career NHL game on Tue., Feb. 13, at Nashville.

**Jonas Siegenthaler** played in his 300<sup>th</sup> career NHL game on Sun., Mar. 3, at Los Angeles.

**John Marino** earned his 100<sup>th</sup> career point, after collecting an assist on N. Hischier's third-period goal on Feb. 17.

Marino earned his first game-winning goal of the season (17:43, 3<sup>rd</sup> period) on Tues., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, which also marked the blueliner's second-career game-winning goal.

**Erik Haula** was 15/19 on face-offs (79%) on Tue., Feb. 6, vs Colorado, yet Haula's career-high is 19 face-off wins which were earned on Oct. 13, 2022, at Philadelphia (82.6%).

Haula recorded a career-high eight hits via Tue., Dec. 19, vs Philadelphia. His prior career-high for hits in a single game was four (12 times).

Haula tied a season-high six shots on goal in a game via Mon., Mar. 1, at Anaheim.

**Jack Hughes** ranks first on New Jersey with 250 shots (2<sup>nd</sup>, J. Bratt, 223 SOG).

**Kevin Bahl** leads all Jersey blueliners with 137 hits, while **Curtis Lazar** (168) leads all Devils skaters this season.

Bahl recorded a career-high 10 hits on Nov. 18, 2023, vs the NY Rangers.

Bahl logged a career-high 23:37 TOI on Jan. 11, at Tampa, which led all Devils skaters in the contest.

Bahl leads Jersey with 93 blocks this season, while **Simon Nemec** ranks second with 89 blocks.

Nemec's 5.44 blocks, per 60:00 ranks first in franchise history for all rookie blueliners in a single season (since 2005-06).

**Keep in mind...**The most blocks that a rookie skater earned in team history for a single season is Johnny Oduya who earned 119 in 2006-07.

**John Marino** ranks second on New Jersey for ATOI (21:13), while **Luke Hughes** ranks first on New Jersey for ATOI (21:13).

## TIMELESS...

**Dawson Mercer** has played in 236 consecutive games since he began his NHL career in 2021-22. Mercer owns the franchise record for the most consecutive games played to start an NHL career, after he passed Scott Gomez 140 consecutive games played from the start of an NHL career.

Mercer's 236 consecutive games played currently ranks (tied) 10<sup>th</sup> in the NHL for all active skaters.

Mercer's 236 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21).

## BETWEEN THE PIPES

**Jake Allen** logged his Devils debut on Thu., Mar. 14, at Dallas, and logged 35 saves on 37 shots against. He also turned away all six shots he faced on the team's penalty-kill.

Per NHL Pr, "Allen became the fifth (Devils) goaltender in the past 10 years to record a win in their team debut, joining **Nico Daws** (Oct. 23, 2021 vs BUF), **Jonathan Bernier** (Oct. 15, 2021 vs CHI), **Eric Comrie** (Jan. 31, 2021 at BUF) and **Scott Wedgewood** (March 20, 2016 vs CBJ)."

Allen logged his second start with New Jersey on Sun., Mar. 17, at Vegas.

Allen denied all 14 shots that he faced in the first period and then all 11 shots against in the second period at Vegas. Allen recorded 58 consecutive saves dating to the first period against Dallas before allowing a goal 2:57 into the third period against Vegas today. The veteran netminder logged a shutout sequence of 90:53 dating to the Dallas game on Thu., Mar. 14.

The longest shutout sequence that a Devils netminder recorded this season was **Akira Schmid**, who logged a shutout sequence of 99:21 from Nov. 24, 2023, to Nov 30, 2023, and over the span of three games played (52 saves).

Allen's longest career shutout sequence is 184:38 via Oct. 23, 2014, to Nov. 6, 2014.

Allen owned a .946 save percentage in his first three games with the team, which is the fourth-highest save percentage of any goalie through their first three appearances with the Devils franchise (at any point in their career).

Allen's 105 saves after his first three games played since joining the Devils were the most for any goaltender after their first three appearances with the franchise.

**Kaapo Kahkonen** not only earned his fourth career shutout on Sun., Mar. 24, at the Islanders (36 saves), but earned the team's first shutout for the 2023-24 campaign.

Kahkonen earned his first shutout since Nov. 29, 2022, at Montreal (4-0, W, 28 saves).

Kahkonen is the first Finnish netminder in franchise history who earned a shutout.
