## WHAT TO KNOW

- New Jersey opened its 42<sup>nd</sup> season since 1982-83, and began the campaign in Europe for the second time in franchise history.
- The Devils last played in the NHL's Global Series on Oct. 6, 2018, when the team defeated Edmonton 5-2 in Gothenburg Sweden. Nico Hischier and Stefan Noesen are the two current Devils skaters who also played in Gothenburg for New Jersey.
- New Jersey improved to 3-0-0 in the NHL's Global Series, after defeating Buffalo 4-1 on Fri., Oct. 4., and then 3-1 on Sat., Oct. 5.
- The Devils and Utah face-off for the first time in franchise history. The meeting marks the first of two contests against Utah this season:
  - Next: March 1, 2025, at Utah.
- The Devils are 7-3-1 all-time against an expansion franchise in their first-ever meeting.
- Monday's contest marks the team's first matinee game played in North America for 2024-25.

### Coach's Corner

New head coach **Sheldon Keefe** improved to 4-0-0 in NHL games played outside of North America and became the first NHL head coach to win his first four career games outside of North America.

Keefe led Toronto to 46, or more, wins in his last three seasons with the Leafs. He led Toronto to 50 wins in 2022-23 and then 54 victories in 2021-22. His career points% in parts of five NHL seasons (all w/ TOR) are .665.

#### **Extra Frame**

The Devils experienced two shootout rounds last season, which marked the team's fewest shootout rounds in a single season since its inception in 2005-06.

Before 2023-24, the fewest shootout rounds that the Devils experienced in a single season was five, which occurred in 2010-11 and then the shortened 2020-21 campaign.

New Jersey's five overtime/shootout losses in 2023-24 were tied for the second-fewest in franchise history (2010-11) since the shootout was installed in 2005-06. The team's fewest overtime/shootout round losses is four, which was logged in 2008-09.

New Jersey recorded more than 50 power-play goals in a season for the first time since 2017-18 (54).

The last time the team recorded more than 55 PPG in a single campaign was in 2006-07, after the team earned 65 PPG.

### **LET'S LIGHT UP THE ROCK**

The Devils have recorded 85 consecutive regular-season home games without an opponent shutting out the team. The marker is the second-longest stretch without being shut out at home in franchise history.

The last time that the Devils were shut out at the Rock dates to Apr. 24, 2022, after a 3-0 loss vs Detroit.

#### IN THE DOTS

- The Devils ranked third in the NHL for overall face-off percentage (53.6%) in 2023-24.
- The Devils ranked first in the NHL for defensive-zone face-offs at 55.8% last season.
- The team's face-off% in 2023-24 marked the team's highest percentage for a single season since face-offs were tracked in 1997-98. Prior to 2023-24, the team's highest overall face-off% was 51.4%, which was logged in 1997-98.
- The team's 55.8 defensive-zone face-off% in 2023-24 marked the team's highest D-zone face-off% since face-offs were tracked in 1997-98. Prior to this season, the team's highest defensive-zone face-off% was 54.7 in 2022-23

# PLAYER NOTES

#### THE NEW GUYS

- New Jersey acquired Paul Coitter, Brenden Dillon, Johnathan Kovacevic, Jacob Markstrom, Stefan Noesen, Brett Pesce and Tomas Tatar over the offseason.
- Noesen played for New Jersey from 2016-17 to 2018-19, while Tatar played in two seasons for New Jersey from 2021-22 to 2022-23.

### JACK

- The lefthanded shot owns 283 career points (114g-169a).
- Per NHL Pr, Hughes "can join Patrick Kane (369), Auston Matthews (351), Jack Eichel (337) and Matthew Tkachuk (300) as the fifth active U.S.-born player with 300+ career points before his 24th birthday."
- Per NHL Pr, "surpassed **Wilf Paiement** (168 in 361 GP) for the third most before age 24 in franchise history, behind **Kirk Muller** (265 in 450 GP) and **Scott Gomez** (195 in 344 GP)."

### **BRATTER**

- The Swedish forward is fresh off recording a career-high 56 assists, 83 points and seven game-winning goals in 2023-24.
- Bratt has played in all 82 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2023-24.
  - He has played in 171 consecutive games dating to April 24, 2022.
  - o He is one of 27 active NHL skaters who've played in 170, or more, consecutive games.
- Bratt, who was drafted in the sixth round, 162<sup>nd</sup> overall ranks sixth for all skaters from that draft with 362 career points. He ranks first for all players drafted in the third round, or later, from that draft.
- The lefthanded shot earned his first goal of the season, after netting a power-play goal against Toronto on Thu., Oct. 10.
- Bratt enters Monday's contest riding a three-game point streak (1g-2a).

#### TIMO

- Timo Meier completed his first full season with New Jersey in 2023-24 and recorded 52 points (28g-24a) in 69 games played.
- The Swiss native earned 28 points (17g-11a) in his final 25 games played in 2023-24, while his 17 goals were tied for the fourth most goals scored over that time frame.
- Meier is approaching a few milestones with 193 career goals and 192 assists, which sits at 385 career points.
- Meier enters Monday's contest riding a three-game point streak (2g-1a).

## **PALAT**

- Ondrej Palat enters his third season with New Jersey and in his native country.
- He is one of 10 Czechia-born players in NHL history to win multiple Stanley Cup championships.
- Palat ranks third for all active Czechia-born skaters with 477 career points (162g-315a).

#### THE CAPTAIN

- Nico Hischier completed his third season as team captain with New Jersey.
- The captain logged a face-off% of 56.6 last season, which marked a career high. He also logged a career-high 19:29 ATOI in 2023-24.
- His 20 even-strength goals last season marked his second-highest for his career in a single season (21 EVG, 2022-23).
- Hischier collected his second point in an NHL Global Series game, after he earned one assist against Buffalo on Fri., Oct. 4.
- The captain won a career-high 21 face-offs on Sat., Oct. 5, against Buffalo. which was one win shy of Travis Zajac's franchise record off 22 face-off wins (Feb. 19, 2017, at NYI).
- Hischier's prior career high for face-off wins was 19, which he earned on Nov. 1, 2019, vs Philadelphia (19/25, 76%).
- Hischier has won 61 of 102 face-offs (59.8%), which marks the most total face-off wins in the NHL, per Oct. 13.
  - o His 42 even-strength face-off wins also ranked first in the NHL, per Oct. 13.

#### **KOVECHKIN**

- Defenseman Jonathan Kovacevic earned two points (1g-1a) against Buffalo on Fri. Oct. 4, which marked the blueliner's third
  career multi-point effort.
- The two points tied a career-high earned in a single game. The last time Kovacevic earned a multi-point effort was on April 9, 2024, vs Philadelphia (0g-2a).
- The blueliner earned both points in the first period. Additionally, Kovacevic earned his first career game-winning goal.
- Per NHL Pr, Kovacevic "became the first defenseman and eighth player in Devils/Scouts/Rockies history with a game-winning goal in his team debut, following forwards Jimmy Hayes (Oct. 7, 2017), Zach Parise (Oct. 5, 2005), Mike Rupp (Jan. 13, 2003), Denis Pederson (Oct. 12, 1995), Tom Chorske (Oct. 5, 1991), Steve Tambellini (March 11, 1981) and Nelson Pyatt (Oct. 5, 1976)."
- Kovacevic earned his third point for the 2024-25 campaign, after he collected the primary assist on T. Meier's second-period goal on Thu., Oct. 10, against Toronto.

### **FAMOUS SEAMUS**

- Rookie defenseman Seamus Casey netted his first career NHL goal, which was also earned on the power play 11:59 into the second period.
- Per NHL Pr, Casey became the fifth player in NHL history whose first career NHL goal was recorded outside of North America (Nate Guenin (2011 Premiere Series), Tyler Seguin (2010 Premiere Series), Alex Goligoski (2008 Premiere Series) and Bobby Ryan (2007 Premiere Series). Kulich would be the first player to do so in his home country.) Casey also "became the second-youngest defenseman to score a goal in a game outside North America, behind Derek Morris (20 years, 47 days) during the GAME ONe Japan 2000."

Casey, 20 years old, 271 days, is the 11<sup>th</sup> youngest defenseman in franchise history who earned their first career NHL goal:

Mercer's 250 consecutive games played currently ranks 8th in the NHL for all active skaters, per Oct. 13.

Mercer's 250 consecutive games played ranks ninth all-time in franchise history and passed Damon Severson's 208 consecutive games played (4/7/18 – 5/10/21). Aaron Broten's streak of 266 consecutive games played from 1982-83 to 1985-86 ranks eighth all-time for franchise history.

**Jake Allen** returns to Jersey and for his first full season. The netminder's 361 saves with New Jersey from March 14 to the end of the season ranked third for all NHL goaltenders over that time frame. Allen is fresh off earning his 196<sup>th</sup> career win, after he turned away 17 of 18 shots against Buffalo in Prague on Sat., Oct. 5.
